"It is no exaggeration to say that the partnership of the county agent and the country newspaper editor has, within the past 30 years, brought about a revolution in farm methods," said Director Wilson in a recent statement in connection with National Newspaper week.

Wilson pointed out that when the county agent entered the agricultural picture some 25 years ago, he leaned heavily on the country editor from the earliest days.

The country papers have assisted the county agents in their work, which last year included the conducting of 700,000 demonstrations on farms and in country homes.

MORE STUDENTS SET NEW RECORD AT OREGON STATE

Oregon State College—A heavy influx of new students, particularly women, has brought a 2 per cent increase in fall term registration at Oregon State college, which will reach a new record total of about 4700 when the late registration is completed.

An 11 per cent increase in new students was shown, with 1862 enrolled at the end of the first week compared with 1682 at the corresponding time a year ago.

Enrollment of women was 6 per cent of last year, and, with more than 1600 now registered, the co-ed student body is the largest in history.

BETTER OUTLOOK REPORTED BY O.S.C. ON FARM PRODUCTS

Moderately improved farm market prospects in general are indicated from information just published by the Oregon agricultural extension service, at least for crops showing no material increase in available supplies for market during the 1940-41 season.

The improvement is expected to be associated with the somewhat higher level of consumer purchasing power expected in the current marketing season compared with 1939-40.

The report deals more specifically with market prospects for apples, potatoes, turkeys, and walnuts, all important commercial products of Oregon which are marketed largely during the fall and winter months.

Another section of the extension service report deals with farm income prospects for Oregon in 1940 and indicates a probable gain of around 5 per cent over 1939, owing to a higher general average farm price level in 1940 and probably a slight increase in gross volume of production.

Considerable data are given on imports of forage crop seeds, receipts of which from foreign countries have declined sharply during recent months compared with the same period last year.
