SEEDING ON BURN IN THIS REGION FOUND SUCCESSFUL

The apparently successful seeding of freshly burned logged-over land to mixed grasses and legumes is attracting wide attention on the Pat Doherty ranch near Vinson in Umatilla county.

The seeding was done in December, 1939, after fire swept several hundred acres of Doherty's summer range on upper Butter creek in August. Today, an almost sod-like stand of grass, ankle-to-knee-high, is reported by Area Conservationist Millard D. Rodman of the oil Conservation service to be covering the entire 200 or more acres that were seeded. Another 200 acres in the same burn that were left unseeded for comparison purposes, he said, still are bare, except for scattered pine grass, moss and other vegetation.

The Soil Conservation service did the seeding in cooperation with the O.S.C. experiment station through the Pendleton field station, and County Agent Walter Holt. The owner furnished five men who did the seeding with hand seeders. The service supplied the seed for this observational erosion-control project.

Five 40-acre plots were seeded to different mixtures of grasses and legumes, Doherty agreeing to keep his sheep off the area until the summer of 1941.

"Although it will take time to tell how well and which grasses will

stand up through the coming years on the burned area." Rodman said, "control of erosion by this first year's rank stand of grass is assured."

Grasses and legumes reported showing up the best are, in order, tall oat grass, English rye grass, crested wheatgrass, orchard grass, timothy, alfalfa, sweet clover, hairy vetch and mountain brome grass. These have not yet been through a hard winter, however. Severe weather is expected to eliminate some.
