TURKEY POOL IS IN FULL SWING

The Christmas turkey pool at the local plant of the Eastern Oregon Turkey Growers is now in full motion with a full capacity crew working at top speed. The present run is

expected to last for at least two weeks. The birds killed this week will go to New York while those killed next week will be labeled for Los Angeles.

Wednesday the 12th and 13th cars of the season were being filled. It was estimated that the two weeks run will fill 14 cars. These added to the nine already on the market makes a total of 23 cars shipped from Hermiston this year.

The price outlook the past week has been more encouraging.

BILL JACKSON TO BE IN WHO'S WHO

William "Bill" Jackson, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. M. Jackson of the Minnehaha district, who will receive his A. B. degree from Pacific university in June, is among the few students of the country who are to be listed for the second year hand-running in Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges. The book will be released in January or February.

This publication is published through the cooperation of over 500 American universities and colleges. It is the only means of national recognition for graduates which is devoid of politics, fees and dues.

The purpose of Who's Who is to serve as an incentive for students to get the most out of their college careers, as a means of compensation to students for what they have already done, as a recommendation to the business world, and as a standard of measurement for students comparable to such agencies as Phi Beta Kappa and the Rhodes Scholarship award.

Mr. Jackson is president of the Student Body at Pacific, president of Alpha Zeta fraternity, and chairman of the Men's Dormitory Council. He

is also a member of Blue Key national honor fraternity.

Mr. Jackson graduated from Hermiston high school in the class of 1936 and during his high school career was active in student government, and was a member of Torch Honor society.

OREGON TO HAVE 10,000 TONS OF SUPERPHOSPHATES

Approximately 10,000 tons of 20 per cent superphosphate will be available for Oregon participants in the AAA program during 1941, as a result of arrangements completed by the state AAA office at Corvallis with national officials of the program.

These conservation materials will be available for distribution on much the same basis as has been in force this year. Cooperators may obtain the phosphate and have the cost deducted from their benefit earnings at the end of the season. Superphosphate is one of a number of conservation materials distributed as an aid to the establishment and production of legumes, grasses and other soil conserving crops.

While the actual price has not been definitely determined, it is known that it will be comparable from a value standpoint with that charged for the higher test treble phosphate this year. In addition to its phosphorus, superphosphate is worth about \$6 a ton for its gypsum content. The superphosphate is being shipped to Portland by boat and will be available for distribution after January 1. Details may be obtained from any county AAA office.

This year 4823 tons of the treble phosphate were distributed through the AAA organization, which is far more than has ever before been used in Oregon in a similar period.

FRESHMEN TO SPONSOR FORMAL

The Christmas Formal this year will be sponsored by the freshman class under the supervision of Miss Lavina May Lynch. This event has become an annual affair, bringing to a close the school days prior to the Christmas holidays.

Various organizations and classes have sponsored the dance in past years, namely the Student Council, Girls' League and Lettermen's club, and the senior class.

Money for decorations is taken from the general student body fund and if by some rare chance there is a profit, it in turn goes back into the student body fund.

The general plan for decorations has not yet been disclosed.

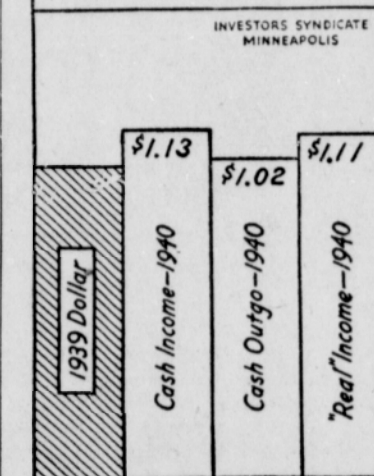
JUNIOR CLASS SELECTS RINGS

American Income Rises 13 Cents; Living Costs Up 2 Cents Over Year Ago

PURCHASING POWER AUGUST, 1940, Compared with AUGUST, 1939



THE above chart, showing how the average American fared in national income changes in the last twelve months, is based on the monthly consumers' study of Investors Syndicate of Minneapolis.

Mr. and Mrs. Public in August had a "real income" of \$1.11, or an increase of eleven cents on the dollar over the same 1939 month. This "real income" is not a subtraction of cash income and expenditures, but an average relative of these figures designed to show how living costs affect adjusted income dollars. Cash income of Mr. and Mrs. Public in August was \$1.13 for every \$1 a year earlier. This gain of thirteen cents on the dollar resulted from the following changes per dollar: wages up fifteen cents and salaries seven cents; investment income was up seven cents and other income was up nineteen cents on the dollar.

Rents in August were up one cent from a year ago, but clothing was off one cent. Foods were five cents higher and miscellaneous items were up two cents making living expenses up a total of two cents.
