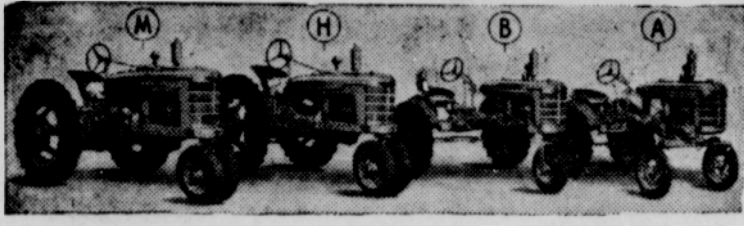

TEST GRASS PLOTS FACE BOMBING

Army pilots who practice on the newly laid out bombing field in northern Morrow county may have some practice in seeing what they can miss as well as what they can hit. Several experimental grass plots were established several years ago through cooperation of County Agent C. D. Conrad, and the Soil Conservation service. After a conference with war department officials, those in charge have decided to leave the plots be in the hope that they may be missed by the bombers.

Valuable information from these experiments may be expected in the next few years, says Conrad.

U. S. MARINE CORPS TO BE EXPANDED

The U. S. Marine Corps will probably be authorized very shortly to recruit a larger number of men than it was allowed to enlist all during 1940, it was revealed by Major James B. Hardie, recruiting officer in charge of this district.

The names of a considerable number of applicants who have already been accepted have been placed on a waiting list, pending such time as they can actually be enlisted.

The quota for February will most likely exceed that for this month, the major believes. Probably by March the Marine Corps will be allowed to expand to such a degree that new recruiting stations will have to be established in this district to take care of enlistments. Recommendations for the opening up of new stations at Klamath Falls, Oregon, and Lewiston, Idaho, have already been

made. At present the Portland district maintains recruiting stations at Salem and LaGrande, Oregon, at Walla Walla, Wn., and Boise, Idaho, in addition to headquarters at Portland.
