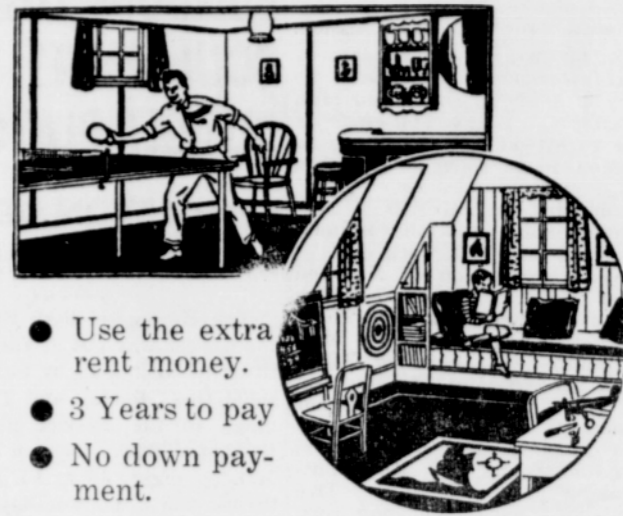
Engagement Is Announced
