TAX AUDITOR PLANS VISIT

An income tax auditor will be in Pendleton March 3 to 6 from the hours of 8:00 a. m. to 5:00 p. m. to assist income taxpayers in preparing their 1940 state income tax returns.

Every single person must file a return if his total net income is \$800 or more or if his surtax net income is \$500 or more during the year. Every married couple living together must file a joint return or two separate returns if their combined net income is \$1,500 or more.

Returns must be filed on or before April 1, 1941.

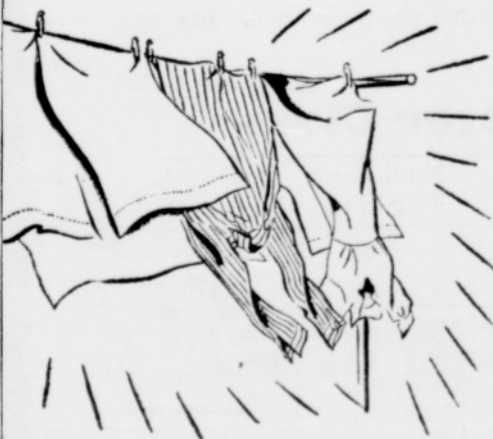
