In the past, we have not maintained a checking system on the return of empty milk bottles, because this would entail extra bookkeeping and corresponding increase in the cost of the milk delivered to your door. We would like to continue on this basis, but in order to do so, we must ask your cooperation in the matter of returning empty bottles promptly.

At the present time, we must maintain a far greater supply of bottles on hand than would be necessary if each customer would have an empty bottle on his doorstep for each one delivered.

During the past few weeks this condition has become a real problem with the increase in the number of families being served.

We thank you for your patronage and hope to continue serving you with the best quality of milk available.
