ORDINANCE NO. 193

An ordinance to regulate and license certain business, trades, callings and employment carried on for gain in the City of Hermiston, Oregon, regulating the manner of issuing licenses, fixing the fees therefor, providing for the manner of enforcing the ordinance and prescribing the penalties for violations of the provisions hereof, repealing ordinances Numbers 33, 35, 51 and 174, and declaring an emergency.

THE CITY OF HERMISTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, company or corporation to engage in or carry on for gain, any business, trade, profession or calling for which a license is herein required, without first obtaining the license required therefor.

SECTION 2. No license shall be issued to any person, firm, company or corporation until the required fee therefor has been paid to the City Recorder nor until said license shall have been approved by the City Council, or any committee designated by the City Council for that purpose.

SECTION 3. Every such license shall specify by name the person, firm, company or corporation to whom it shall be issued and shall designate the particular place at which the business shall be carried on. No license issued under the provisions of this ordinance shall be in any manner transferable or assignable and such business shall not be carried on by any other person or at any other place than that specified in the license.

SECTION 4. Where more than one business, trade, calling or employment for which a license is required, is or shall be carried on by any person, firm, company or corporation, a license shall be obtained for each of said businesses, trades, callings or employments.

SECTION 5. Every license hereafter issued shall be for one-quarter year and shall expire March 1, June 1, September 1 and December 1 of each year, and licenses shall be required for the following businesses, trades, callings and employments for the following fees:

Bowling alley 5.00
Card room, 1 table 5.00

Theater 5.00

SECTION 6. No places where cards are played shall contain booths or private rooms and all doors leading to any card rooms shall be unlocked whenever cards are being played or the place is open for business.

SECTION 7. The term "Peddler" as used in this ordinance shall not mean or be taken to include any producer of products produced from the soil of the State of Oregon, or his employe, nor any person selling nursery products.

SECTION 8. Each license issued as herein provided shall contain the name, residence and particular place of business of the licensee, the particular business, trade, profession or calling the transaction of which is therein licensed, the date of the issuance and expiration of said license and the amount paid for the same, and shall be displayed in a conspicuous place in the office, store or place of business of said licensee.

SECTION 9. The City Council shall have the right to revoke any license in case the holder thereof shall be guilty of any violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance, or any other ordinance of the City of Hermiston or of any of the provisions of the laws of the State of Oregon or of the United States, and shall have the right to refuse the granting of any license to any person, firm, company or corporation which has heretofore or before the issuance of such license, been found guilty of any such violation. The City Council shall also have the right to revoke any license the holder of which shall not operate his place of business in a clean, orderly manner or who shall permit any violations of Ordinances of the City or any State or Federal laws in his place of business.

SECTION 10. Any person, firm, company or corporation who shall within the City of Hermiston engage in, prosecute or carry on any business, trade, calling or employment for gain, for which a license is required, without first obtaining a license as herein provided, or who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00 for each violation thereof, and in default of the payment of such fine, he, she or they shall be confined in the City Jail for a period of one day for each \$2.00 of such fine, and upon conviction such license shall be cancelled.

SECTION 11. That Ordinances Nos. 33, 35, 51 and 174 be, and they hereby are repealed.

SECTION 12. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City and an emergency

is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed the Council this 19th day of February, 1941, by the vote of five councilmen for the ordinance and no councilmen against the ordinance.
