1065 WOMEN FROM 27 COUNTIES GET NEW HOME IDEAS

A near-record attendance from more sections of the state than usual characterized the eleventh annual home interests conference at Oregon State college as 1065 women from 27 counties spent a busy three and one-half days in getting concentrated re-ports on the latest developments in the profession of homemaking.

The extension workers in home economics, who with the school of home economics sponsor this annual event, had expected this year's at-tendance to be somewhat below normal because of a number of interfer-ing factors, but instead women were here from distant as well as nearby points in exceptional numbers. Clackamas county led with an attendance of 118, followed by Multnomah with 96, Lane 102, and Linn 101.

Governor Charles A. Sprague set the conference off on a popular note when, in his address at the opening banquet, he pointed out factors which he said are bringing a revival of the family as a vital important social unit. The family is proving to be more enduring than governments and other supposedly powerful groups, he said.

The conference had a distinctly re-gious note this year by reason of the visit of Dr. E. Stanley Jones, noted missionary worker, Dr. John T. Reisner, head of the interdenomina-tional rural missions board, and the presence on the campus of a group of men and women attending the first short course for missionaries.

Group sessions on two days brought the delegates the latest de-velopments in such fields as family
