FLAKED FISH En Casserole

1 cup Coration Milk diluted with 1 cup water
1/2 cup grated cheese
2 cups fish flakes (May be crabmeat, salmon, or lobster)

2 eggs
3 rolled crackers
2 tbs. butter, melted
Juice of 1 lemon

Combine fish flakes and cheese, add beaten eggs and milk, and pour into buttered casserole. Cover with crackers, rolled and mixed with melted butter. Pour over all lemon juice. Cover, set casserole in a pan of warm water. Bake in a moderate oven 30 minutes. Serves 8.

CHANGES COUNCIL MEETING NIGHTS

The Hermiston city council will hereafter meet every first and third Friday of each month instead of every first and third Wednesday as heretofore. The change was made to accommodate council members.

At a meeting of the group Wednesday night, the city recorder was instructed to accept license fees for all those business and amusement establishments already in operation, in accordance with Ordinance 193, recently passed by the council. These

fees are due immediately and payable at the office of Charles Taylor, city recorder. All other new applications will have to meet the approval of the council before the recorder has the authority to issue the licenses.

Cooperation Is Asked

During the past few months a plan has been attempted to list all available vacant houses and rooms in Hermiston and surrounding territory. During the past month this information has been kept at the Hermiston Auto Co. Persons who have obtained tenants should make this information

known with the stenographer at the Hermiston Auto Co. so that the list may be brought up to date.

JUNIOR HIGH TO PRESENT PROGRAM

The Hermiston Junior high school is planning a spring program for March 28, to be known as the "Parade of Nations." This performance combines all the extra curricular subjects of the upper grades and consists of folk songs and folk dances of several nations.

Native costumes will be used for the program.

MUSIC FESTIVAL ANNOUNCED FOR APRIL 25 AND 26

Eastern Oregon College of Education—The Eastern Oregon High School Music Festival will be held at the Eastern Oregon College of Education on April 25 and 26, according to an announcement made by John M. Miller, director of teacher training at the college and in general charge of festival arrangements.

The festival will constitute the official contest for all high schools of eastern Oregon and will also include a non-competitive division scheduled for the 26th. A critic will be on hand to give suggestions and criticisms for the benefit of the non-competitors.

Instrumental events of the competitive contests of the two-day festival will be held on Friday, April 25, and vocal numbers on Saturday. The various events will include band, classes A, B, C, D; orchestra, same classes; mixed choruses, classes A, B, C; boys' choruses, same classes; girls' choruses, same classes; vocal and instrumental solos and vocal and instrumental ensembles from all classes.

High schools are classified according to total enrollment as follows: A, 750 or more enrolled; B, 250 to 750 enrolled; C, 100 to 250 enrolled; and D, less than 100. A school may elect to compete in a class higher, but may not compete in a lower class.

Students appearing in any of the contests must be regularly enrolled and making passing grades in the school they represent. Post-graduates who may participate are limited to those who finished high school

at the end of the first semester, according to a new ruling for this year's festival.

Each contestant who makes a first division rating will be entitled to enter the regional contest in Tacoma on May 16 and 17. In addition to this, the National Music Educators' Conference will present a certificate of award to students placing in the first, second or third divisions.

All entries for the Music festival, either in the competitive or non-competitive groups, should be sent to Mr. Miller at Eastern Oregon College before April 7.

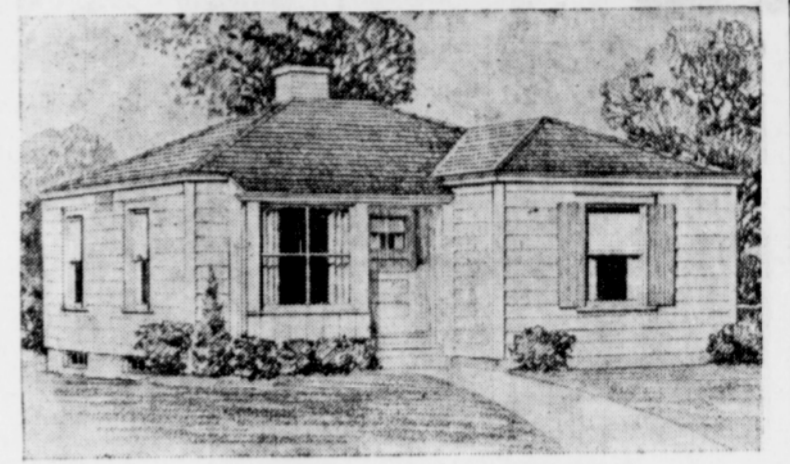
SENIORS PREPARE FOR 'SECOND FIDDLE' NEXT WEEK FRIDAY

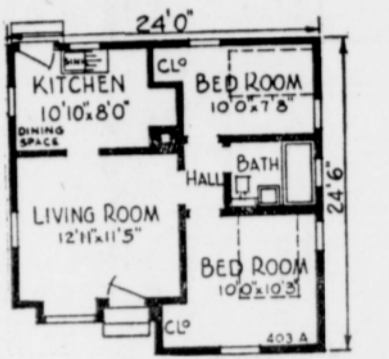
