WATER FORECAST MEETS SET FOR APRIL 1 TO 12

The schedule of meetings to determine the final water forecasts for the various irrigation districts of Oregon has been announced by R. A. Work, associate irrigation engineer in charge of the Oregon cooperative snow surveys sponsored by the Soil Conservation service and the Oregon experiment station. Six district meetings are scheduled, to be followed by the annual Columbia basin interstate regional meetings to be held at Portland Saturday, April 12.

The district meeting begins at The Dalles April 1 where the north central Oregon situation will be discussed with the local water master, forestry officials, the county agent, and others interested. The other meetings will be held as follows: Umatilla-Walla Walla district at Pendleton, April 2; eastern and northeastern Oregon at Baker, April 3; southeastern Oregon at Lakeview, April 5; central Oregon at Prineville, April 7; and southern Oregon at Klamath Falls, April 8. Work as head of the forecasting project and John C. Burtner, extension editor from Oregon State college, will attend all of the meetings.

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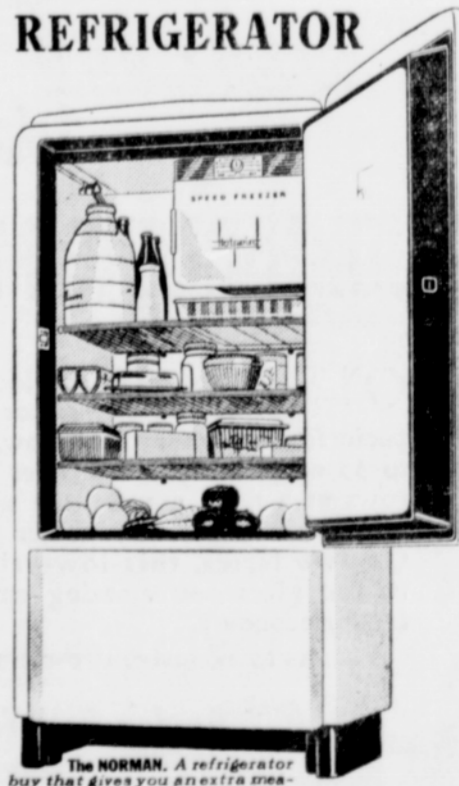
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
