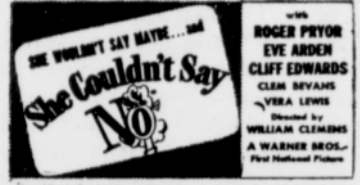

August Dron is the carpenter in charge at the Hisholm Grain & Feed Store where extensive improvements are being made in the front office.

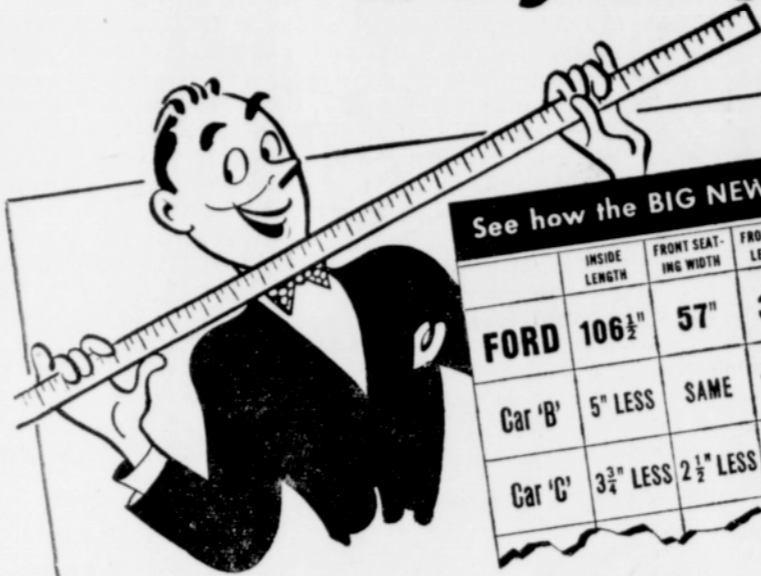
