CO-OP. GROCERY OPENS NEW STORE

for the new wood shelving which blends pleasingly with the bright colors of the labels on the merchandise. The store has added the service and convenience of a clean ladies rest room.

This cooperative was organized a number of years ago by a group of consumers and incorporated under the state laws governing cooperative enterprises. It is a Rochdale type of consumer co-op., and any consumer is eligible to membership upon payment of a membership fee of one dollar. These members are in effect in business for themselves, owning and operating by democratic processes the

business which furnishes them with goods.

Ben F. Gerking, the present manager, came from Pendleton here a little over two years ago. Mr. Gerking has had over 16 years experience in the grocery business, having worked with several chain stores and also several successful independent grocery organizations as well. Many will remember him as the manager of the first chain store to open up in Hermiston. He was with the Mac-Marr stores at that time.

The present board of directors of the co-op. store consists of A. W. Turnblad, president, Mrs. Minnie McFarlin, secretary, Wm. Kik, J. W. McMullen and H. R. Hartley. This board of directors is elected from the membership and they run the business, meeting monthly to transact business and hear reports from the manager. The board hires the manager to care for the actual operation of the store.

Other personnel in the store includes Mrs. Mabel Gerking, clerk and bookkeeper, and Glen Warner, clerk, also a student of Northwest Christian college.

Talking with Mr. Gerking one soon gathers the impression that he is an enthusiast on groceries and on cooperation. He says that he is proud to be a groceryman and proud to be affiliated with the cooperative movement. He believes that cooperative principles are the soundest principles on which a business can be organized. He says that we the people need to develop and increase our skill in representative and collective action in order that our rights and privileges as citizens of this democracy may not be lost. It is a natural law that one must use what one has or else lose it.

He says that co-op. organizations are not only the citizen's guarantee against exploitation, being a yardstick by which all other business can be measured but they are also a training school in democracy. His advice is to join and take active part in the affairs of cooperatives, always insisting that democratic methods prevail in the conduct of their affairs. Co-op methods are and should always be object lessons in democracy.
