COTTAGE CHEESE PIE

- 1 cup unseasoned cottage cheese
- 1/2 cup Carnation Milk
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 3 eggs, beaten slightly
- 1/2 tsp. grated lemon rind
- Plain Pastry

Put cheese through a fine sieve. Add remaining ingredients slowly. Mix until very smooth, strain into a plate or pan lined with pastry and bake in a hot oven (425° F.) until crust begins to brown. Then reduce heat to slow oven (300° F.) and bake until custard is firm, or an inserted knife comes out clean.

JAMES W. WAID BURIED SUNDAY

Funeral services for James W. Waid were held Sunday afternoon in the Stanfield Presbyterian church with Rev. C. Warner of Hermiston officiating. Burial was in the Echo cemetery.

Mr. Wade was born October 4, 1851, in Savannah, Tenn., and lived to be 89 years of age. He moved with his parents to the state of Missouri when quite young. He was married to Thurza E. Cox in McDowell, Mo., August 6, 1876. They would have celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary in August, 1941. To this union were born six children, one son Joe, preceding his father in death in 1910.

Surviving are his wife, Lenna, Claude and Vernon, all of Stanfield, Mrs. Lulu White of Ukiah and Mrs. Wanda Duvall of Lexington, besides six grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

He came to Oregon with his family in 1906, settling on a homestead near Lexington. They moved to Stanfield in 1912 where the family has since made their home.

Mr. Waid was particularly known for his home loving qualities. He joined the church when a young man.
