Map above shows the tour's route which leads through Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, and ends in Kansas City July 19. Included for inspection are co-op grocery stores, gas and oil associations, rural electric co-ops, fertilizer factories, farm machinery plants, insurance co-ops, credit unions, student co-ops and co-operative recreation camps.
