**TURKEY GROWERS WARNED AGAINST COPPER SULPHATE**

Turkey producers are cautioned against the use of copper sulphate in the drinking water in some material just released by Dr. E. M. Dickinson, associate veterinarian, Oregon State college, through the office of Assistant County Agent M. E. Knickerbocker.

Turkey growers are constantly looking for some new practice that will prevent disease problems from showing up in their young poults. Many poultry raisers fail to realize there is no substitute for good sanitation and general management of their poultry. Simply because a solution of 1:2000 copper sulphate in the drinking water has been of some help as a treatment for certain turkey diseases, there has sprung up the common practice of giving water, treated with copper sulphate, to baby poults in the hope that it might prevent these diseases. Unfortunately, copper sulphate is not a cure-all, and at times it may even prove harmful. The theory, that because a certain drug or chemical may be a good preventive, does not work out in practice.

There are a number of reasons why it is neither necessary nor desirable to start baby poults on water treated with copper sulphate. To begin with, there is no disease that poults may be matched with that will be prevented by giving copper sulphate in the drinking water. Further, there is danger that newly-hatched poults will not start to drink properly if they are started on treated water. Experience has shown, that in some broods of poult, they may refuse to drink at all, and a rapid serious mortality will follow. It is readily acknowledged that thousands of poults have been started on treated water with no apparent harm. However, that is no justification for recommending treated water for starting poults since it has no value at this time and may actually be harmful.

Danger from copper poisoning is a possibility that must be kept in mind if birds are kept on treated water over an extended period of time. Since copper is somewhat accumulative, it should not be given to birds except when some disease is present that will be eliminated by its use. Giving copper sulphate indiscriminately may build up a copper level that might prove serious if some disease did show up where additional copper sulphate treated water would be desirable to control the disease.

There is no good reason nor justification for using copper sulphate treated water as a preventive and there are many reasons why this practice should not be used. Assistant County Agent M. E. Knickerbocker will go to Pendleton Saturday afternoon where he will broadcast the regular weekly program of the extension service over KUJ Walla Walla.

**LIVESTOCK MARKING SERVICE QUESTION**

Attention of the state department of agriculture officials has been called to the fact that salesmen have been soliciting ranchers of eastern Oregon in an attempt to sell them a poultry and livestock marking service. The Oregon laws provide that the department of agriculture of the state must record all livestock brands and furnish county clerks of the various counties with copies of them.

Officials further point out that the law requires that any person desiring to use a brand must register it with the department of agriculture animal division and that no person shall claim to own any animal or poultry brand or mark that has not been so recorded.

Brands recorded as the law provides are acceptable by the courts as evidence of ownership of the branded stock or poultry, and this is of extreme importance to stockmen.

The department if further charged with preventing the use of conflicting brands and marks, and any person is violating the law who attempts to use a brand of another owned and recorded with the state department of agriculture.

For those these reasons, the service now being offered to stockmen will not benefit those purchasing it and the use of such tattoo mark or brand not recorded would not conform to the Oregon laws.

Brands may be recorded with the department of agriculture for a dollar fee, which is far less than the amount the certain solicitors are attempting to collect from farmers and ranchers of the state. Officers of the department of agriculture are working throughout the state to prevent livestock and poultry thefts, this being part of the state's service in connection with the use of recorded brands.
