### HENRY SOMMERER WINS SCHOLARSHIP

OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Corvallis, August 21—(Special)—Henry Sommerer, Jr., a graduate of Hermiston union high school, has received a \$100 scholarship from Sears, Roebuck and company to attend Oregon State college this fall. He is one of 25 high school students in Oregon Wash., visited her father, Lewis to receive such scholarships this year.
