SHERIFF GOAD URGES TRAFFIC SAFETY

Substantial reduction in fatalities in Oregon cities offset the slight increase in rural deaths and enable this state to show a four per cent decrease in traffic fatalities for the first six months of the year, Sheriff Goad of Umatilla county said today. The national average shows an increase of 17 per cent.

However, in an effort to effect a still greater reduction in fatalities in this state, Sheriff Goad called upon citizens of this county to enlist in a campaign to cut down the rural fatalities by driving more carefully while traveling the open highways.
