DEER SEASON TO OPEN SATURDAY IN THIS REGION

Oregon's deer season will open Saturday, September 20, throughout the state and continue through October 25. The bag limit this year, according to the Oregon State Game Commission, is one blacktailed or one mule deer having not less than forked horns. Both deer coupons from the general hunting license must be attached to either species when killed.

Limited doe deer seasons will also be held this year, and 3,800 tags have already been sold. One of doe areas is located portions of Lake and Klamath counties while the other is in portions of Grant, Crook and Wheeler counties. All hunters who possess doe tags must register at checking stations before entering the hunting area and must again register upon leaving the area, regardless of whether or not a kill has been made.

The 1941 antelope hunt will be in two areas. The first antelope season will open on September 22 and continue through October 5 in that part of Malheur county south of the Burns-Ontario highway. The other antelope season will open in portions
