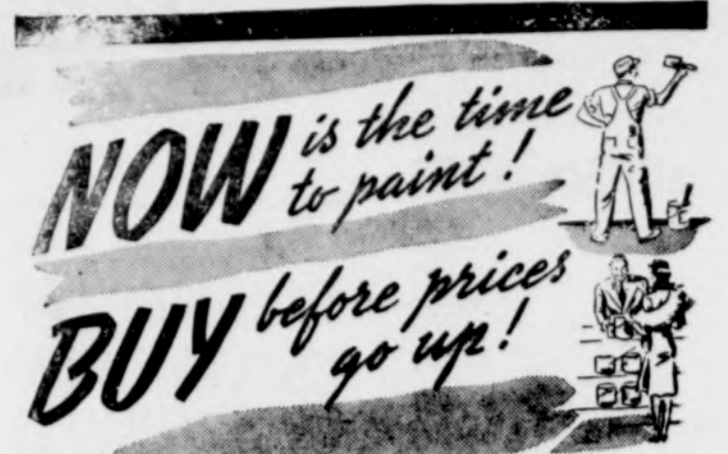
Miss Maxine Blinston flew to Portland via United Air Lines Friday evening and spent the week-end at Seaside and Astoria, returning Tuesday.
