Mr. and Mrs. James Arnberg were Milton-Freewater visitors Sunday.

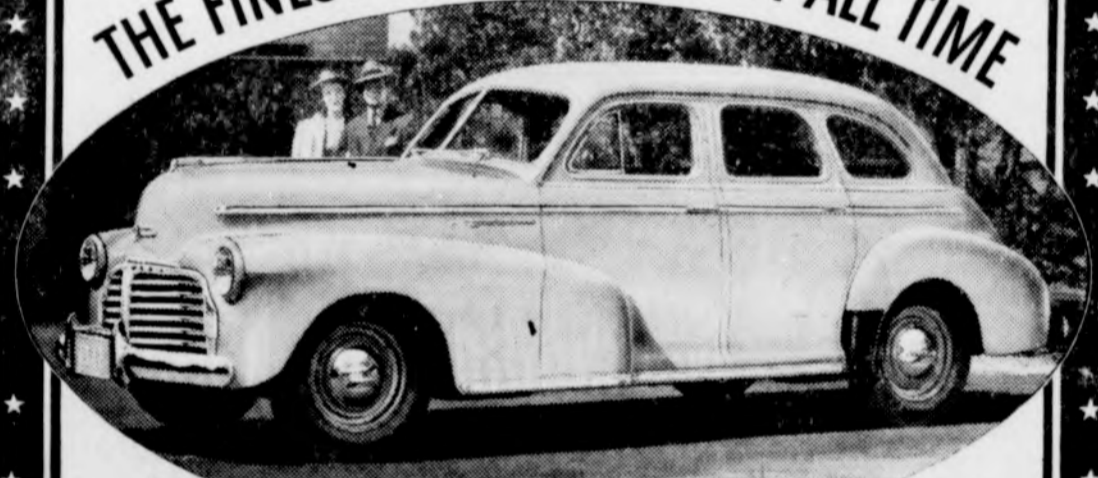
