### TWO POULTRY MEETINGS SET FOR OCTOBER

Two meetings involving Oregon poultry men have recently been announced for October.

On the 15th of this month a one-day course of instruction on the field test for pullorum disease in chickens will be given at Oregon State college, at the request of the state department of agriculture. The session will start at 10 o'clock and is open, with the payment of a registration fee, to all those interested in complying with regulations for shipment of baby chicks into certain states, and for those desiring training for participation in the program of the Oregon Poultry Improvement association.

The second meeting is the annual two-day fall session of the Oregon Baby Chick association and will be held in the Oregon City high school October 21 and 22, starting at 10

o'clock each day. The first day's meeting is limited to members or prospective members of the association. The program on the second day is open to the public and is arranged to be of benefit particularly to flock owners producing hatching eggs.

Fred Cockell of Milwaukee, newly elected president of the International Baby Chick association, will be among the speakers, as will representatives of Oregon State college and others.
