

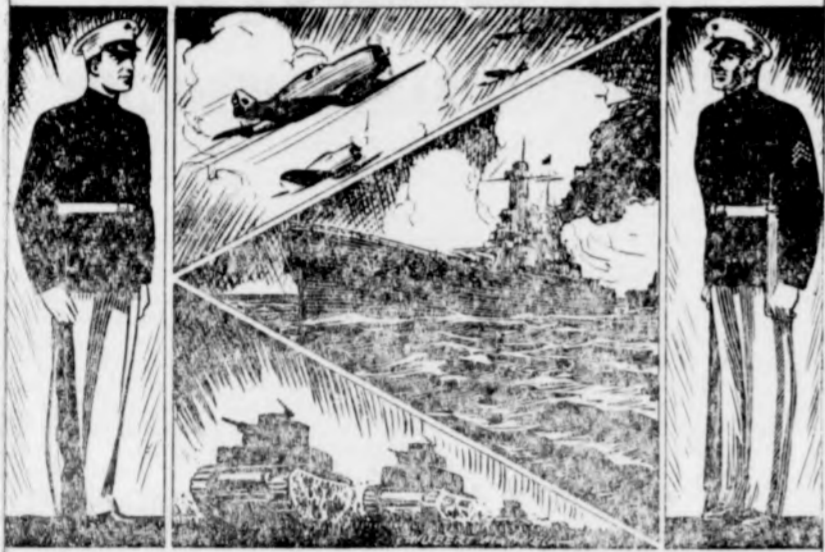

Our Trailer Camp...

You would be surprised at the kinds of people you meet in a trailer camp. I have never been around one until this summer. Since our farm is so close to the Umatilla Ordnance Depot, we decided to put in tents and trailer houses. We have quite a few large trees and people kept coming to the house and asking for trailer or tent space.

We finally opened it up for a trailer camp. We sold our cows and started preparing. Then people started bringing in their trailer houses and setting up tents. Right from the first my dad wouldn't let any people in that he thought would cause trouble or would not be clean.

One day some Indians came and wanted a tent space. The old car that they were in looked as if it would fall apart any minute; it had a tattered, dirty old tent, and all sorts of camping equipment. He wouldn't think of letting them in and were the people in camp glad! Some of them

came to him later and said that if he had put in those Indians the campers would have all moved out.

The people who are there now have come from all over the United States. There are some from Idaho and California, some from Washington and Oregon, and two or three from Montana and Nevada. There are even some from Texas, Kansas, Alabama and New Mexico. I have noticed just recently that there were also a few from Wyoming, South Dakota, and Oklahoma.

The people who are camped there work at the ordnance depot. Some of the men brought their families but others just have camping equipment and two or three men stay together.

They have all sorts of shacks built around the place. There are quite a few nice little two-room houses also. Most of the people have built up sides and put floors in their tents and have made tent-houses. Others who are still living in their tents on the ground plan to build them up later. There is always a lack of either time or money.

We have almost forty trailer houses. Many of the people prefer tent houses because they say that they have more room in them.

There are over 155 different families camped at our place and many of them have children of school age. The parents are all anxious for their children to be in school. About 38 children should go to school from our place.

Electricity is a major problem in the camp. We have been trying since the first of July to get electricity in the camp and still it's not in. The store has electric lights now. The wiring in the camp and in our house is being done by an electrician from our camp. Since he hasn't a license the job must be inspected when it is completed.

We must have water in the camp, too. The people from the store have taken that job over and are installing an electric pump. The water must be piped from the well by our place to the store and camp. They didn't order enough pipe and had to send for more before they could finish. The people have to carry all of their water and will be relieved when the water is finally over there.

Most of the campers have their mail sent in care of us. The mail carrier puts it all in our box and it usually fills it to overflowing. Before school started I took all of the letters and small packages over to the camp and delivered them. Sometimes I couldn't locate a person who had received mail and I would write down the name on a piece of paper and put it up on a post at the well, then when he saw that he had some mail at the house he would stop and call for it. Quite a few people have C.O.D.'s sent out in care of us also. If the person isn't there to get them when the mail comes we always take them out, then when they come to get them they can just pay us.

We have also been delivering milk at the camp. We got it from the farmers who live near us. We have been delivering 75 or more bottles

every day. We have quit now and one of the dairies is delivering the milk. We have been trying since the camp was started to get one of them to come out but until now they haven't had enough milk.

Some people from Washington leased a plot of land from us to build a store on. It took quite a long while to complete it but they are almost finished now. They plan to have it going soon.

There are people moving in and out of the camp all of the time. As soon as someone moves out it isn't long before someone else moves in on the vacated space.
