Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Money spent the Armistice day holiday in Spokane, Wash. Mr. Money is employed at the Ordnance depot.

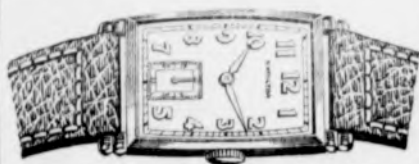
Mr. and Mrs. Paul Van Patten motored to The Dalles Saturday evening to spend Sunday visiting relatives.

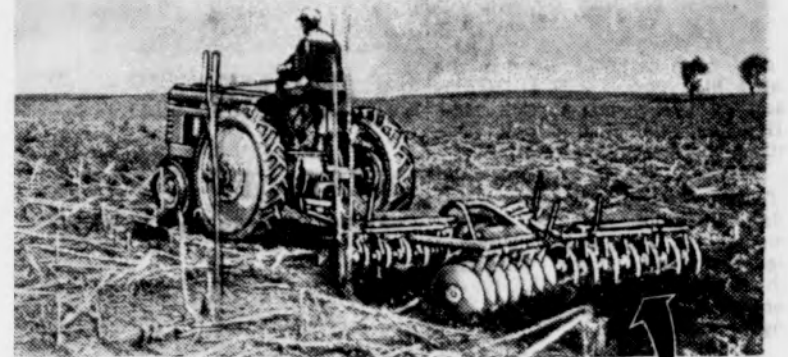
