Until very recently, Mrs. Wilson has been youth councillor and employment supervisor with the National Youth Administration, and previously was a probation officer in a Juvenile Court. She has served as a case worker with several welfare agencies, including the National Red Cross, the Federal Emergency Relief Administration and the Family Service Bureau in Middletown, Ohio.
