**SUGGESTIONS FOR FARM FOLKS**

Folks in and around Hermiston can join the ranks in the all-out effort to prevent waste.

Already every rag is being saved, every scrap of paper is being neatly stacked and tied in bundles for the Boy Scouts.

But what about food and household supplies. It's butchering season on the farms. Do you know what a good cooking compound can be made using half lard and half beef suet. You try that combination. It makes good bread, good deep fat, good pastry.

As for the leaf-fat in beef and the tallow of mutton, why not make into soap according to the following recipe: 1 can lye: 1 quart warm water; 2 T borax; 1/2 C warm water; 6 lbs. grease; 1 cup household ammonia.

Dissolve the lye in a quart of warm water. Dissolve the borax in 1/2 cup of warm water. Melt the grease, and into it slowly stir the dissolved lye with a wooden stick. Stir the mixture until it is as thick as honey, then add the dissolved borax and the ammonia. Stir about 5 minutes longer, then pour into a mold. No cooking required. When firm, cut in cakes, using a fine wire or a piece of string. Use when 4 weeks old. Note: Do not use aluminum, as earthenware, or enamel is best. An iron kettle is good.

Elk and venison tallow also make lovely soap. For soap from cracklings, use the recipe on the lye can.
