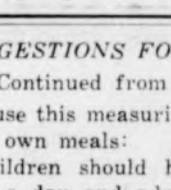
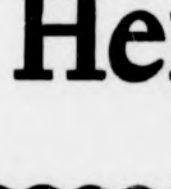
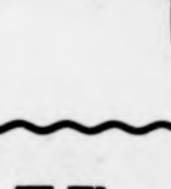

can use this measuring stick to judge your own meals:
Children should have 1 quart of milk a day and adults 1 pint. One or more servings of tomatoes or citrus fruit, one serving of leafy green and yellow vegetables, 2 servings of other vegetables or fruit and 1 serving of potatoes should be included in the meals for one day. Besides this 1 egg, 1 serving of meat, fish, or cheese, whole grain products and 2 tablespoons of butter are necessary each day if we are to have well balanced meals.
