VARIED PROGRAM OF MUSIC SET FOR THURSDAY, APRIL 23

The band and choruses of the Hermiston high school, directed by G. C. Humphreys, have been very busy during the past few weeks completing plans for the "Spring Music Demonstration," which will be given Thursday, April 23, at 8:00 p. m. in the high school auditorium.

The program is a successor to the one held each spring in former years, called the Spring Music Varieties, which was directed by Miss Gwendolyn Ross, and consisted of choral groups alone.

The first section of the program will be played by the high school band, and contains a varied selection of marches and classical numbers, approximately as follows:

The Banqueters, March, Holmes; Intermezzo, Arlesienne Suite, Bizet; Coronation March, Le Prophete, Meyerbeer; Valse, Chopin; Chief Executive, March, Lundquist; Spanish Dances, No. 1 and 2, Mowskowski; Army Ordnance Song, dedicated to Col. Scott, U. O. D., Arms for the Love of America, Berlin; Poeme, Fibich, Transition Music.

The choral section of the program will be composed of British and American songs, with many different types of each represented. An approximate list of the program is as follows:

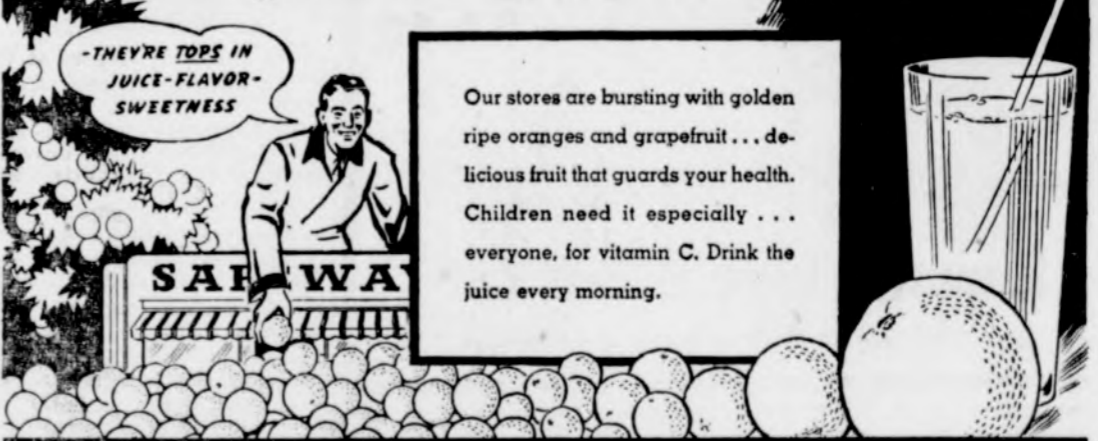
