VETERINARIAN NEEDED HERE

Bill Bennett, supervisor of the Farm Security Administration, and Gene Lear, assistant county agent, are making an effort to get a qualified veterinarian to locate in Hermiston in order to be of service to west Umatilla county and north Morrow county farmers. A questionnaire was sent to all west Umatilla county farmers by Lear in order to get the farmer's opinions regarding the feasibility of guaranteeing a certain amount of the veterinarian's salary in order to get one to locate here. Response to these questionnaires from over 50 farmers has indicated outstanding majority in favor of making what efforts are necessary to get a veterinarian here.

Mr. Bennett has held meetings in different communities of the Farm Security borrowers and the opinion of these groups has been to do whatever is reasonable to get a veterinarian here.

Several business firms of Hermiston, who deal mostly with farmers, have indicated their endorsement of any plan to get the service of a veterinarian available, since these firms realize that there have been large losses of all kinds from disease and other causes, some of which could have been prevented.

BELTON TO FINISH VACCINATING

Dr. M. J. Belton, assistant state veterinarian from La Grande, is now vaccinating over 500 head of horses and mules in west Umatilla county. Dr. Belton is making every effort to cover the entire district in four days, finishing Saturday, May 9.
