11,340 VISITED U. S. O. BUILDING

The local U. S. O. club of Hermiston wishes to announce that since the opening of its building on January 2, the total attendance has been eleven thousand, three hundred and forty-two. Although U. S. O. came to Hermiston primarily to present a program for defense workers and their families, the staff has also offered social and recreation programs for soldiers stationed here temporarily. U. S. O. is happy to announce that 1,672 soldiers have been served from the recreation center since the second of January.

The U. S. O. club has also been used by community groups such as the Red Cross, Girl Scouts, Business clubs, Nutrition classes and all civilian defense groups. The U. S. O. staff conducts within its program handcraft classes, story hour for children and also provides indoor and outdoor recreation for all ages.

During the 1942 U. S. O. campaign the local staff will be very happy to welcome all visitors to the U. S. O. club, and on behalf of the National U. S. O. committee, the local staff wishes to thank the residents of Hermiston for their splendid cooperation.

During the next few weeks an active campaign for additional U.S.O. funds will be carried on in Hermiston. A quota of \$600 has been allotted to Hermiston, according to James D. Todd, local chairman of the drive. Further information concerning the campaign will be described in next week's issue of The Herald.

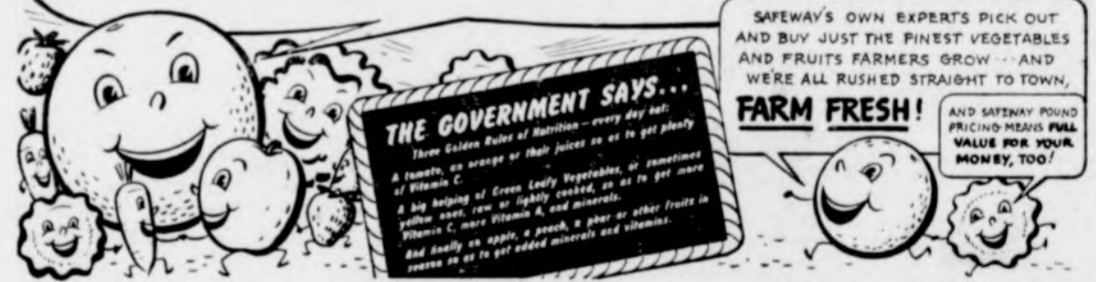
