WHEAT STORAGE SPACE NEEDED TO SAVE CROP

Time is short to save a third to a half of Oregon's wheat crop, which will be homeless at harvest unless preparations are begun now.

The farmer who does not have grain bags now, or who does not have assurance from his elevator operator that there will be room for his wheat, has only a few weeks remaining in which to provide storage facilities for his own grain.

Growers who must build storage on their farms should do these things immediately, Mr. Coppock said:

1. If their project will cost more than \$1,000, they should apply at once for War Production board authorization and a project rating.

2. He should tell his building supply dealer what nails he will need and make immediate arrangements to get his lumber in time to start construction.

Information about types of storage that will qualify under Commodity Credit farm storage regulations may be obtained from the county AAA committee.

Credit is available now to farmers to finance such constructions, through banks and the Production Credit association.

Farm Security administration is accepting applications from its clients and from farmers without other credit resources for loans to finance up to 3,500 bushels of storage on individual farms.

The chairman also reminded growers that Commodity Credit will advance a storage allowance of 7 cents a bushel on all farm storage loans at the time the loan is made.

ROTENONE USE TO BE CURTAILED

Because the war and shipping difficulties have curtailed imports of rotenone, the War Production board has issued an order dated April 13 to conserve present supplies for use as insecticides on important food crops.

Effect of the order is to insure a supply of rotenone for controlling weevil on Austrian field peas, dry edible peas, canning peas, and other important Oregon food crops.

The order prohibits the future use of rotenone in the manufacture of all sprays and dusts for control of household insects, poultry, pet and livestock parasites and sprays for ornamental trees and shrubs.

An exception to the foregoing use restriction permits the use of rotenone manufactured prior to the date of the order.

The War Board chairman also pointed out that the Office of Price Administration has established ceiling prices on rotenone. Under terms of the order, cost to farmer of three-fourth per cent rotenone should not be more than 2 1/2 cents per pound more than the price he paid last year.

STUDENTS SIGN FOR EMPLOYMENT

Nearly 80 per cent of Oregon's older school children will be available for seasonal farm work or other wartime emergencies this summer, according to a check made during the last few weeks under direction of the United States Employment service.

Of the 63,173 pupils who filled out the questionnaire distributed throughout the state, only 14,188 indicated they would not be available. Of these 6,089 were girls and 8,099 boys.

Along with the 300,000 women who recently registered voluntarily, card files of the older school children will be classified at 22 full-time employment offices and temporary agricultural offices.

The chairman also reminded growers that Commodity Credit will advance a storage allowance of 7 cents a bushel on all farm storage loans at the time the loan is made.
