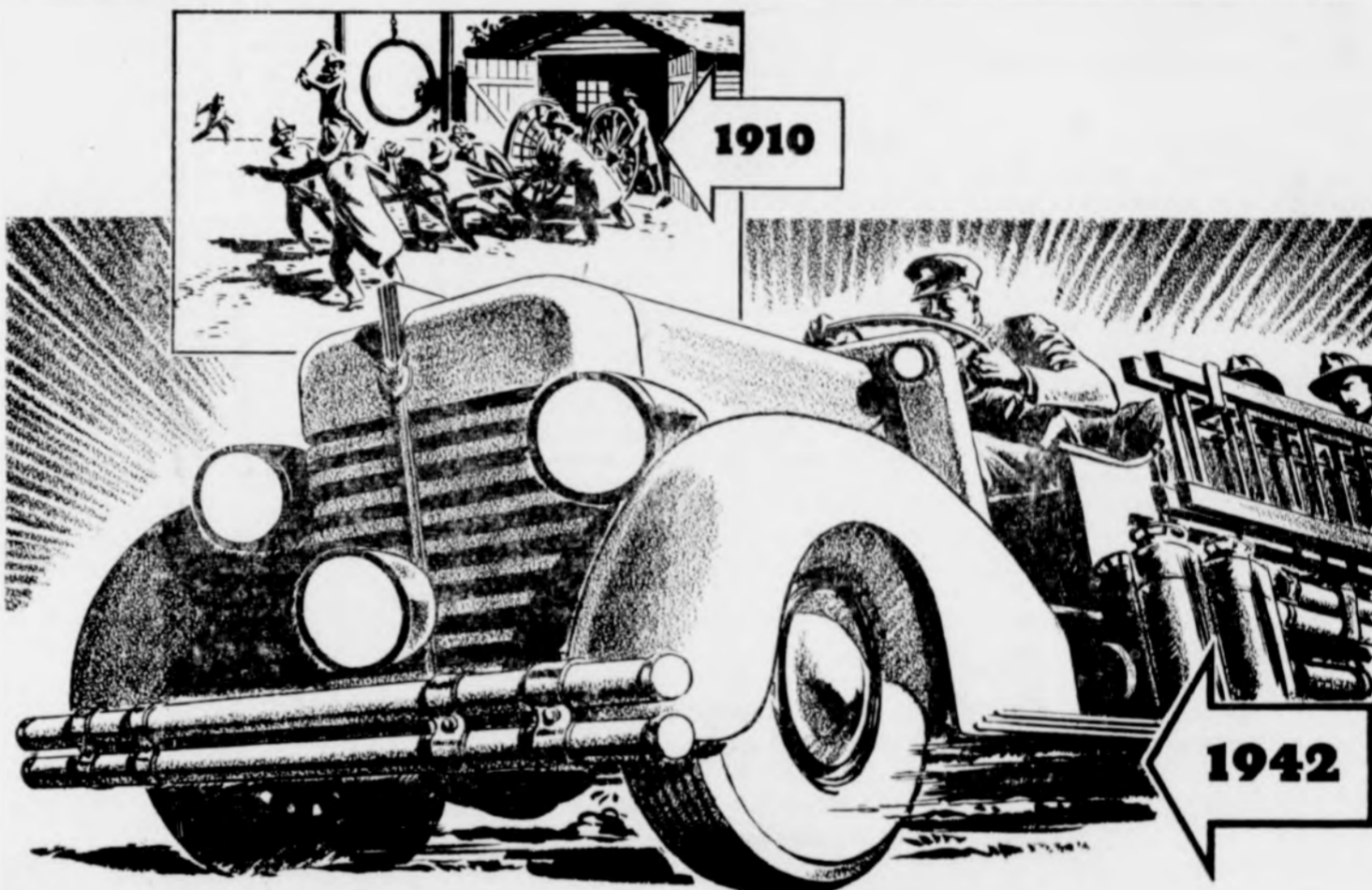
and service credit a second year were presented to Eileen Hunt, Cecil Hunt and Rosemary Keller.

The advanced writing certificate of the Rice system of business writing were earned by the members of the graduating class.

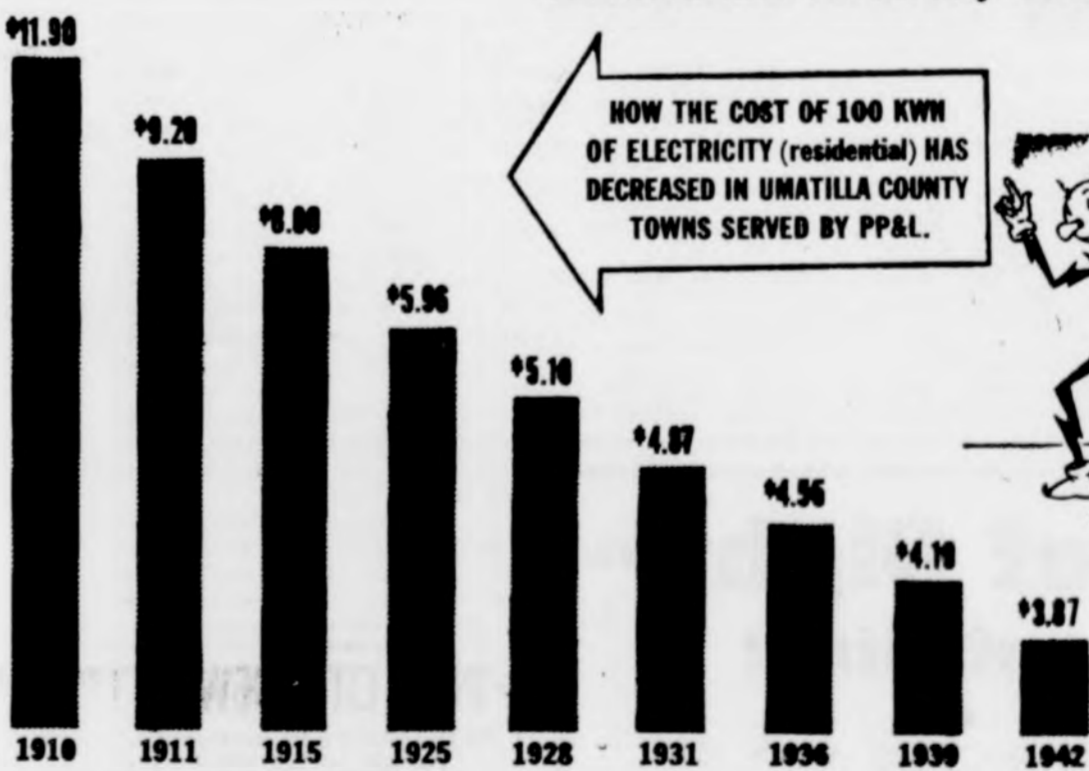

Further Restrictions on Telephone Installations Are Necessary to Save Materials Vital to the War

The latest War Production Board Order further restricts the use by telephone companies of materials essential to the war effort.
