### COUNTY AAA TO MAKE CHECK ON FARM PROGRAM

"Food-for-Freedom" production on Umatilla county farms and their participation in the 1942 agricultural conservation program is being surveyed in the annual AAA compliance check now underway throughout the county, announces A. R. Coppock, chairman of the county AAA committee.

To conserve rubber and manpower needed in agriculture and vital defense industries, a farm-to-farm canvass and acreage measurement such as has been conducted in the past, will not be made this year.

Instead, we expect to do the major portion of our supervision from the county office. The farmers will be notified of the time to appear at the county office and the supervisor and farmer together will fill out the necessary reports of performance. We have tried this on a few farmers this spring and believe that in most cases it will be very satisfactory. Of course, there will still have to be some country supervision such as checking protected fallow, green manure crops, clean cultivation of perennial noxious weeds, etc. It will, also, be necessary for the county office to recheck a percentage of all farms since the state representatives will make a similar survey, and we want to be sure that our supervision is satisfactory. We have already made a complete check-up on wheat acreage and are mostly interested in the soil conservation phase of the program.

This year's compliance check is more than a determination of participation in the farm program. In a sense it amounts to an inventory of the county's capacity for production of the foods needed to win the war. Mr. Coppock said in announcing the new plan. Information obtained will be invaluable in planning our contribution to the larder of America and our allies in 1943. The hearty cooperation of farmers in helping obtain this information will be a definite contribution to the county's war effort.

The provisions of the agricultural conservation program have been modified in order to encourage the maximum production of needed farm commodities and at the same time conserve soil resources for top production throughout the war emergency and in the years to come.

The county office of the Agricultural Adjustment Agency at 329 S. W. First St., Pendleton, is now prepared to sell wheat owned by Commodity Credit Corporation, to feeders of livestock or poultry, wheat stored at the following stations: Milton, Athena, Pendleton and Weston.

At each of these points the price of the wheat is 91.6c per bushel during July, the buyer furnishing sacks, paying the warehouseman \$1.00 per ton sacking charge, plus 1/2c per bushel loading out charge.

### LIMITED NUMBER OF VACANCIES FOR GUARD DUTY

A limited number of vacancies yet exist this month for enlistment in class IV of the marine corps reserve for guard duty, the marine corps recruiting substation in Walla Walla has announced. Applicants for light shore duty in the marine reserve must be between 30 and 51 years inclusive, physically sound, with vision not lower than 8/20 without glasses corrected to 18/20 with glasses.

In addition to regular line pay, clothing, quarters and subsistence for themselves, all class IV reservists who are married and maintaining a home will receive \$1.15 per day quarters allowance, which begins upon entrance into service.

All veterans of the last world war will be appointed to the rank of private first class, while former marines who have had four or more years continuous active service will be reappointed to the line rank held upon last discharge, not above sergeant.

Duty in class IV is limited to the continental United States, and all men enlisting are now sent to the recruit depot at San Diego, Cal., for training, prior to assignment to regular duty station.

### BIKE QUOTA IS NOT EXCESSIVE

Residents who have been contemplating jacking up the old bus and obtaining a bicycle for transportation will be somewhat disappointed to learn that the quota for bicycles in Umatilla county has been set at seven. These bicycles may be purchased by eligible workers provided they are engaged in gainful occupations contributing to war work or public welfare, and provided they need the "two-wheelers" at least three days a week for their work or to travel to and from work.

Applications must be made to the rationing board.

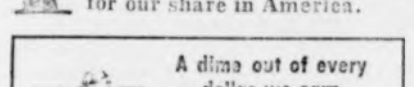
