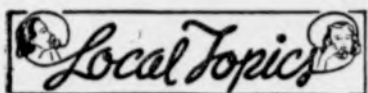

Farm WAR NEWS

War crops Instead of Wheat
 Oregon farmers who underplant 1943 wheat allotments to increase acreage of special war crops will get their full wheat payment, and will not have future wheat allotments reduced because they did not plant the full acreage. The AAA has announced in Washington, D. C. All-out production of war crops asked, as it's extremely unlikely that production can exceed demand.

More Welding Rod Asked

To keep farm equipment in top shape for the heavy food production job, the Department of Agriculture has asked the War Production Board to release additional supplies of welding rod for farm repair and maintenance. Meanwhile, where breakdowns of farm machinery hold up farm production because of lack of welding rods or electrodes, repairmen should contact WPB's field office, Bedell Building, Portland, for emergency assistance.

Farm Prices President's Topic

Farm prices, and the part that agriculture can play in the battle against inflation, are expected to be an important part of President Roosevelt's Labor day talk September 7.

Tire Quota Cut

Importance of the job undertaken by county farm transportation committees is further emphasized by OPA announcement that September tire quotas have been sharply reduced from August quotas.

NOTICE!

The following resolution adopted by the Hermiston Irrigation District Board of Directors is being published for the purpose of notifying all water users served by the East Division Umatilla Project Oregon that they may make any adjustments necessary for the purpose of watering their stock during the fall and winter months.

RESOLUTION:
 WHEREAS: It has been called to the attention of the District Board of Directors that the water table in certain districts of the project is rising at an alarming rate, thereby threatening the inundation of farm lands; and

WHEREAS: It is impossible to properly maintain drainage ditches because of extreme saturation of surrounding soil and sloughing of banks; and

WHEREAS: The directors after thorough investigation have concluded that too much water is being run on the project, especially after the regular irrigation season; and

WHEREAS: It is deemed advisable and in the public interest, that the following resolution be adopted: **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** By the Hermiston Irrigation District Board of Directors that: at the end of each irrigation season all water shall be shut out of the distribution system serving the east division of the Umatilla Project and no water run in the system until the opening of the regular irrigation season the following spring.

The above resolution was unanimously adopted by the Hermiston Irrigation District Board of Directors in regular meeting under date of September 1, 1942.

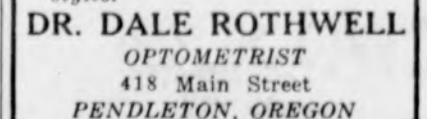
