TO OUR NEW CITY OFFICIALS

We now have a new city structure and it is built of well seasoned material. The members of our governing body are well qualified to do the work of the next two years—and they will have plenty to do. Not only is experience and ability necessary, but the spirit of progress is equally important; if not in the officials alone, in the push of the community.

Hermiston has growing pains and the council will find many spots to apply constructive remedies. The new sewer system will have to be completed, perhaps extended, and the connections will have to be made. The water system will need extensions and enlargements. Sanitation is increasing in importance. City irrigation will require additional pipelines, likely to include some new areas. Streets will require more attention and the expense greater in two years than they were during five previous years.

A reasonable program of municipal planning should be worked out. Construction of houses on unplatted tracts should be restricted to those that conform with future possible street extensions and the laying of sewer and water mains and power lines. Some drainage problems will have to be given attention in the interest of health and property holding taxpayers. The community park, which is a pride of former achievements, will need more attention during the ensuing biennium.

All of which means that Hermiston is putting off its swaddling clothes and, unless properly fed and nurtured by good government and more inspired public welfare, may have the rickets, stomach aches and other growing ills. We have the destiny of an athlete and the substantial basis of a good sized city.

Towns do not just grow up like Topsy. Their growth needs care, direction, management, thought, ambition, inspiration of leadership and loyalty of citizenship. The opportunity is here to increase the facilities for better living, more substantial financial conditions, and the importance of a good town to its surrounding territory. We have the men who can do these things, and a citizenship who will require that they be done and back up their efforts.

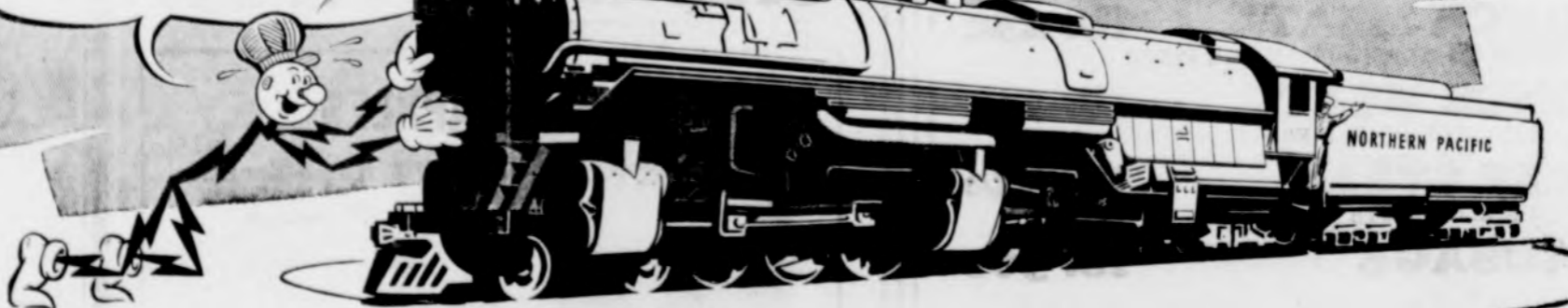
