## THANKSGIVING DINNERS

each cocktail glass and pouring over either grapefruit juice or a bit of French dressing.

For an average turkey of 12 to 16 pounds allow 1 c. dressing per lb. of fowl. Use 1 1/2 lbs. stale bread: 1/2 to 1 lb. butter or margarine; 1 tsp. salt; 1/4 tsp. pepper; 1/4 c. minced onion. If you like, add 2 or 3 beaten eggs, a bit of poultry seasoning; 1 c. chopped celery; and 1 small green pepper chopped. Rub the turkey with fat before placing in a slow oven. Roast at 300 degrees F., and allow 30 minutes per lb. for a bird under 10 lbs. drawn weight; 20 minutes for 10 to 15 lbs.; and 18 minutes for 15 to 20 lbs. Baste frequently, if roasting uncovered.

**Pumpkin Chiffon Pie**  
3 egg yolks, slightly beaten  
1/2 c. sugar  
1 1/4 c. canned pumpkin  
1/2 c. milk  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1/2 tsp. ginger  
1/2 tsp. nutmeg  
1/2 tsp. cinnamon

Cook above ingredients over boiling water until of custard consistency. Pour 1/4 c. cold water into bowl and sprinkle 1 envelope plain gelatine over top. Let stand a few minutes. Stir into hot pumpkin mixture until dissolved. Cool. When mixture begins to congeal, fold into it a meringue made of the 3 egg whites and 3 tsp. sugar. Pile lightly into baked pie shell and chill until ready to serve.  
For the twosomes or families of

three or four, there is a roast chicken for you; or perhaps a wild duck, but here is a dinner suggestion for a festive meal.

### Thanksgiving Dinner Menu

Cider Cocktail  
Stuffed Shoulder of Veal  
Apple Dressing  
Baked Sweet Potatoes  
Julienne Green Beans  
Tossed Greens Salad Bowl  
French Dressing  
Jellied Cranberries  
Plum Pudding or Mince Pie  
Rum Sauce Coffee

To make the cocktail combine 2 c. cider; 1/2 c. orange juice; 1/2 c. pineapple juice. Strain and chill. Serves 6.  
Have the butcher remove bone from shoulder of veal, about 3 to 4 lbs., and make a pocket for the stuffing. Use about 1 c. bread crumbs: one-third to 1/2 c. chopped apple; 1 tbsp. minced onion; 1/4 c. minced celery; 1 egg, beaten; and seasoning to taste. Moistening crumbs with hot water, and mix remaining ingredients lightly together. Stuff into veal, and truss or sew. Roast, basting occasionally, at 300 degrees F., allowing 23 minutes per lb. The jellied cranberries are made by boiling 2 c. sugar and 1 c. water for 5 minutes, adding 3c. washed berries, and cooking, without stirring, until skins pop and berries are clear. Turn into mold or bowl to cool.

**Rum Sauce**  
Mix together 1/2 c. sugar and 1 tsp. cornstarch. Stirring constantly, add slowly 1 c. boiling water. Boil for 5 minutes, remove from fire and add pinch of salt, 2 tsp. butter; and 1 tsp. rum.
