HOLIDAY PUDDING

1 1/2 cups flour
1 tsp. soda
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 cup cloves
1/2 cup shortening
1 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
2 eggs
1 cup grated raw carrots
1 cup grated raw potato
1/2 cup finely chopped citron or substitute
1/2 cup finely chopped candied lemon peel
1 cup seedless raisins
1 cup finely cut walnut meats

Sift flour, measure; sift again with soda, salt, and spices. Cream shortening. Add sugar gradually, creaming well. Add unbeaten eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add carrots and potatoes. Dredge fruit and nut meats in 1/2 cup of flour mixture. Add flour to shortening mixture gradually. Combine with fruits and nut meats, stirring until blended. Fill well-greased 1 1/2-quart mold two-thirds full, cover tightly and place on rack in kettle. Fill kettle with boiling water to 1/2 depth of mold. Cover; steam 3 hours, or until done. Add additional water as needed. Serve hot.

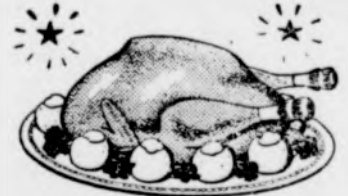
