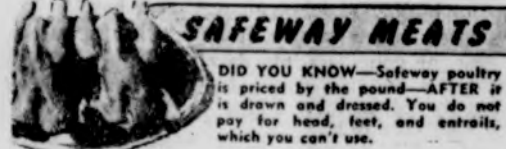

**Soups your whole Family will enjoy**

It's high time for those hearty, satisfying meal-in-themselves soups to stage a comeback, for they're the kind of offerings that do a nourishing wartime job.

BRING BACK THE SOUP POT—Remember the soup pot that simmered continuously on the back of Grandmother's stove? The idea is just as good as it ever was. Save every iota of tripping, rind, scrap and bone, put them in a pot, cover with water, and simmer covered until every bit of good is gleaned from them. Strain from the makings, and you have a rich stock to serve as a basis for soups, gravies and sauces.

BUILDING A SOUP—To this stock, add the water you've saved from cooking vegetables, rice, barley, spaghetti or potatoes. Just heat them in the soup, and be careful not to overcook.

CREAM SOUPS—Thicken the stock with 2 tbsps. flour and 2 tbsps. melted butter or substitute and two cups of milk, plain or diluted evaporated, add 2 cups vegetable water and the cooked vegetables. Mix well and heat to almost boiling.

CANNED AND DEHYDRATED SOUPS—For those quick soups that start the meal off successfully or serve as a light meal in themselves, canned soups or dehydrated soups are the happy answer. These soups are downright delicious and do a rollicking good job of supplementing that meat or meatless course.

FUEL OIL TO
BE RATIONED

Oregon, working with state fuel rationing representative Curry are Daniel Rohrer, Charles B. Maxfield and Charles Nell, all state special fuel oil rationing representatives.

Although fuel oil rationing will begin on February 1, there will be no interruption of fuel oil deliveries, Scully informed state rationing heads in Washington and Oregon. Consumers will be delivered fuel oil on "IOUs" agreeing to turn over to their dealers coupons equivalent to the number of gallons delivered into their tanks after February 1.

Coupons will be distributed to fuel oil users after they have registered, filled out the OPA forms and received their "quota" from their local ration boards.

The ration will be based in part on the heating efficiency of each home. Scully notified Nagelvoort and Van Fleet. The inefficient oil user will take a larger cut in the oil allotted to him than the efficient householder, Scully explained.

Each ration board in the two states will employ a prepared formula to determine the ration of each fuel oil user. The formula is based on the floor area to be heated and the amount of oil used last year.

Average curtailment of 25 per cent in the total fuel oil supply may be reached by cutting some householders 50 per cent and others as little as 15 per cent, Scully explained.

"To do otherwise would be to put a premium on inefficiency," he said.
