### MANY FARMERS COMPLETE SIGNUP

A total of 367 of the 550 farmers of West Umatilla county have signed up to do their part in the food production program for 1943. Farmers have been assisted by the AAA community committees in this sign-up for the last two weeks at the Hermiston USO building.

Forms that the farmers have been filling out contain information concerning crops to be grown in 1943, livestock to be kept and produced, machinery, supplies and labor that will be needed and amount and kind of machinery that is not being used or needed on each farm.

From this information the County

AAA office will ascertain the number of war units that each farm is producing. These war units will then be used to determine a farmers eligibility to purchase farm machinery, supplies and other things that require a priority or a purchase certificate from the County Farm Machinery board or the County War Board. Included in this is the deferment of labor on the farm. Each farm employee, to be deferred, must have 16 war units.

The remaining 183 farmers who have not signed up may call at the assistant county agent's office to get this taken care of.

### SEED POTATO GROWERS LISTED IN U.P. PAMPHLET

A pamphlet listing all certified seed potato growers and dealers in six midwestern and western states has just been released by the Union Pacific railroad, J. W. Jarvis, supervisor of agricultural development, announced.

Dealers and growers, with their location and variety of potato they handle, are listed for the following states: Colorado, Idaho, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

The pamphlet has been sent to all potato shippers in states through which the Union Pacific traverses, to county agents, vocational agriculture teachers, to certified seed potato growers and dealers listed in the pamphlet, and to shippers and dealers in the southern states.
