rooms are 30 x 54 feet, divided about midway, one compartment for reading, the other for games. Both pool and ping pong tables are furnished.

The towns of Umatilla, Echo and Hermiston united in this project and when the time came to secure the necessary articles, we found we had accumulated the huge sum of \$582.43, and with the used materials donated, we set about to complete our task. The pupils of Hermiston high school, having given us their receipts of \$205.73 from scrap drive and with this as an impetus, we began in earnest. Echo and Umatilla gave generously and we were able, with the liberal contributions from our own merchants citizens and organizations, to secure the equipment needed. The committee is especially proud of the new Radio-Victrola, at a cost of \$189, which we were able to give the boys.

This community is proud to have added this small bit toward the comfort and pleasure of the four hundred boys who have been assigned to this room. The committee is duly grateful for the splendid cooperation received and wants you to know that this room is yours too, and at any time you may have something you would like to contribute, get in touch with the chairman and she will see that it is delivered.

### WAR BOND QUIZ

- Q. May I sell a Bond or give it away?  
A. No. War Savings Bonds are not transferable.
- Q. May a beneficiary redeem a Bond during the lifetime of the registered owner?  
A. No. The Bond will be paid to the beneficiary by the Treasury only when the beneficiary has furnished the Treasury with proof of the owner's death.
- Q. How much does a War Bond cost?  
A. The price of War Bonds is 75 percent of their maturity value. For a \$25 denomination Bond, for example, you pay \$18.75 and at maturity in 10 years you receive \$25. This is the smallest Bond you can buy.
- Q. How do I receive my Bond?  
A. If you buy over the counter for cash, it will be delivered at that time. If ordered by mail, it will be mailed to your address or to anyone whom you designate.

Remember—the longer you keep War Bonds, the more valuable they become.
