GOVERNMENT AID MADE AVAILABLE

(Continued from Page 1) swing shift or night shift. We are, we believe, reliably informed that most government employing agencies have been requested, as a matter of government policy, to place mothers of young children on day shift.

Just what activities would be provided can not be definitely stated until we know how many and what children would be involved. However it would not be a summer session of school. For little children such things as play, naps, story telling and general kindergarten or pre-kindergarten activities would prevail. For older children hobby clubs, play ground work, possibly short plays might be featured. All members of the project would receive a hot lunch at noon, and it is at this point that parent's contribution enters.

It has been established as a state wide policy that parents shall pay 50¢ a day for two meals for children, and 25¢ a day for one meal per child, and in this instance since the noon meal would be the only one provided the cost to the parent would be 25¢ per day. The school would provide all school facilities necessary and some of the personnel. The application to the federal government would be to provide funds to pay additional personnel needed to conduct the school.

Dressings styled for salad glamour

Variety in a salad lies not only in the salad ingredients, but also in the dressing. Just a dash of this or that does wonders for your favorite salad dressing and mayonnaise, and changes the entire personality of the salads. And now that spring is getting under way, and fresh vegetables and fruits will be making their appearance on the markets in greater abundance, it's the opportune time to let generous salads assume a featured role on the menu. Salads are vitamin and mineral foods, you know, and do wonders for winter-tired appetites.

RUDY DRESSING—Combine 1 cup salad dressing or mayonnaise with shredded raw beet and the juice of half a lemon. The beet tints the entire dressing. Chopped cooked pickled beets may be used, too. Delicious on raw or cooked vegetable salads.

MOCK HORSERADISH—Add 1/2 cup finely ground cabbage to 1 cup salad dressing or mayonnaise, and touch it up with a dash of salt and pepper and celery seed if desired. Use it as horseradish or as a dressing for meat and vegetable salads. Perfect as a relish on cold plate lunches or with sandwiches.

CHIVE DRESSING—Combine 2 tbsps. finely chopped or sliced chives with 1 cup salad dressing. If you've no chives, then the green tops of onions do the trick. Use this dressing on meat, fish and vegetable salads.

MOCK HOLLANDAISE—Mix 1 cup salad dressing or mayonnaise, 2 tbsps. prepared mustard, 1 tsp. lemon juice, and a dash of salt, and serve as a sauce for hot vegetables such as cauliflower, asparagus, and artichokes.

PEANUT BUTTER DRESSING—To 1 cup of salad dressing or mayonnaise, add 1/4 cup of peanut butter, and a few drops of lemon juice. Mix well and serve on cabbage, carrot, and fruit salads. It's especially good on apple salad.

SWISS MISS DRESSING—Add 1/4 cup shredded Swiss cheese to 1 cup salad dressing or mayonnaise. American cheese has its flavor points, too. Both are the perfect dressings for fruits of all varieties.

PIQUANT DESSERT SAUCE—Mix 1 cup of salad dressing with 1/2 cup fruit juice, any kind is very good, and use as a topping for fruits. If a sweeter dressing is desired, add a bit of honey.

AND REMEMBER—Catsup, prepared mustard, chopped pickles, celery, olives, onion juice, garlic powder, meat and chili sauces, chopped hard cooked egg, horseradish, a dash of sage, chopped parsley and most any spice or herb can be added to salad dressing and mayonnaise for delectable taste variety.
