FARM MACHINERY QUOTAS LIFTED

Changes in the farm machinery rationing program, designed to speed up the placing of equipment on farms where it is needed, were announced yesterday by A. R. Coppock, chairman of the county USDA War Board.

County quotas have been eliminated for all but seven items of farm machinery. The action was taken to make certain that no equipment will remain idle in dealer's stock until after its seasonal use is over.

Farmers holding purchase certificates for any item of farm machinery except tractors, combines, pickup balers, potato diggers and sorters, hay loaders, and side delivery rakes may purchase from any dealer in the state who has the item in stock.

Removal of county quotas and county "tags" will give farmers an opportunity to locate tractor-drawn and tractor-mounted equipment, such as harrows, plows, mowers, discs, and cultivators, of a make and type best suited to the tractor with which it will be used, the chairman explained. quotas in effect, as both the make and number of machines allocated to the county were specified.

The change in the rationing program will not increase the amount of new farm machinery available in Oregon, nor will it eliminate purchase certificates. Applicants for any of the "no-quota" items will be required to locate the needed machinery in a dealer's stock.

Before any additional certificates are issued beyond the amount of the county's original quota, farmers already holding certificates will be given time to locate and buy their machinery, Mr. Coppock said.

The farm rationing committee's policy is to get available machinery into use as speedily as possible, the chairman declared. If the holder of a purchase certificate does not like the make of that particular machine that a local dealer has in stock, the committee will give the machine to some other farmer who has immediate need of it.

How to use it. When a recipe calls for 1 cup milk, mix 1/2 cup water with 1/2 cup evaporated milk and use as directed. In recipes calling for cream, use evaporated milk undiluted.

To make grand whipped "cream," chill evaporated milk to 40° F., place in cold bowl, beat with cold beater.
