Have been hauling over a 1200 mile line to the front lines, munitions, supplies and prisoners. Have been in all the towns of any size in Tunisia, Algiers and French Morocco. Most of the towns have been in Tunisia have been bombed and are now deserted. Bizerte, a city about the size of Pendleton has had practically every building bombed and is a terrible sight. I have to see many in Oregon as soon as we have finished with the Nazis."

### MOTORISTS ARE ASKED TO DRIVE CAREFULLY HERE

Oregon motorists were urged to cooperate with army authorities in preventing accidents in the vicinity of military establishments in Oregon in a statement issued today by Secretary of State Bob Farrell.  
"Traffic accidents in the vicinity of army camps threaten the maintenance of efficient transportation of military supplies, equipment and personnel," Farrell declared. "In these areas military vehicles are constantly on the move and at any time, considerable numbers of these vehicles may be encountered.  
"Under such conditions, a traffic accident is all too likely to hold up essential military movements, even though the army vehicles may not be involved in the accident itself. And of course, careless, thoughtless driving in the vicinity of army camps may involve military vehicles in accidents and result in death or injuries to military personnel and damage or destruction of vital military equipment."  
Army regulations require operators of military vehicles to observe the 35 mile wartime speed limit, but information from authorities in some of the camps in Oregon indicate many instances are noted in which civilian drivers do not observe this speed limit. Farrell reported. The army has asked that civilian drivers cooperate with them in observing this speed regulation as a means of saving lives.  
Farrell suggested careful observance of these rules while driving in the vicinity of army camps:

1. Never exceed the 35 mile limit.
2. Avoid weaving in and out between army vehicles.
3. Be careful in any passing movement while in the vicinity of camps. Remember, large groups of army vehicles or foot personnel may be encountered at any time.
4. Exercise additional care when driving past entrances to army camps. Slow down to be ready for emergencies.
5. When you observe military vehicles approaching the main highway from a side road, be careful, yield the right of way rather than risk an accident.

"It is not much to ask civilians to do their part to avoid accidents that may incapacitate a member of our armed forces, or destroy vital military equipment," Farrell declared. "The army is doing its part to prevent highway accidents, it is up to us, as individual drivers, to do our part by cooperating wholeheartedly in this matter."
