VACANCY AT U.S. NAVAL ACADEMY

Man Lowell Stockman will vacancy at the U. S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, Maryland, for beginning July 1, 1944. Candidates must be not less than 17 years of age and not more than 21 years of age at the first of the calendar year in which they enter the Naval Academy. Applicants should be high school seniors, or graduates of high school, or college students. The Service Commission expects to hold a competitive examination early in 1943 to aid in the selection of candidates for the Academy. Applicants must be legal residents of the Congressional District of Oregon and in perfect physical condition. The next regular vacancy for the District at the U. S. Military Academy is at West Point, New York, in 1944. Persons who are interested and who should write to Congressman Lowell Stockman, 407 House Office Building, Washington, D. C., immediately, so that they may receive additional information and be admitted to the examination.

TAXLESS CARS TO BE TAGGED SOON

A state-wide campaign has been launched against motorists driving their automobiles without the 1943 federal tax stamp, J. W. Maloney, collector of internal revenue, has informed the Herald. Many motorists have failed to purchase the stamp because of a report that congress was considering a bill to abolish the tax for the duration. "The stamps should have been purchased by July 1 and anyone driving a car without the tax stamp is violating the law," stated Mr. Maloney. He added that motorists lacking the stamp will be cited to court if found driving their machines. Stamps are available at the post office.

GUINEA PAPER IS RECEIVED HERE

Mrs. F. H. Edmonds of Umatilla has received a newspaper, Guinea Gold, published in New Guinea for the armed forces there. She received the paper from her son, Sgt. Roger J. Jensen, who is stationed with troops there. He also writes an interesting letter, telling of various pets he is training and of different entertainments.

The paper is crammed full of war news and other stories which would greatly interest soldiers. It is very typical of English printing, indicating that it might be printed by an English concern. Needless to say, Mrs. Edmonds read every portion of the paper.

BIG GAME TAGS NOW AVAILABLE

Applications are now being accepted by the Oregon State Game Commission for the various special big game tags to be issued for the 1943 hunting season. Applications will be kept on file and if by August 16, more applications are received than the specified quota of tags, then a drawing will be held to determine the issuance. If the quota for any particular allotment of tags is not reached by August 16, then all applications on hand will be filled and the rest of the tags issued in the order applications are received until all tags are sold.

A person may apply for a tag by sending in to the Game Commission office at 616 Oregon Building, Port-

land, the specified fee and information as to the type of tag desired, number and kind of hunting license held, and name and address. This information may be mailed in a letter or on a special application form that has been prepared for the purpose.

EXTENSION IS MADE FOR LAND BANK LOANS

Congress has just extended the time for making Land Bank Commission loans to July 1, 1945. R. H. Loveless, secretary-treasurer of the Pendleton Group National Farm Loan Associations, said today.

Since 1933, when commissioner loans were first made available to assist farmers with their credit needs, the Pendleton Group Associations have made approximately 752 such loans for a total of \$1,574,000, according to the secretary. This organization serves the counties of Umatilla and Morrow.

Many farmers, Loveless said, have used both Federal Land Bank and commissioner loans in financing their farm purchase programs. Since 1917, when the Federal Land Bank of Spokane, which serves Idaho, Montana, Oregon and Washington, started operations, the Pendleton group associations have made 884 land bank loans for a total of \$5,134,000.

Despite a heavy volume of land bank and land bank commissioner loans during the early thirties, Loveless is advised that in the last eight years farmers have cut their mortgage indebtedness to the Spokane Bank about a third, and this reduction is continuing under war time conditions. Just the reverse was true in World War I.

FARMERS ABLE TO GET AMMUNITION

A recent release from the State War Board states that an additional supply of 30-30 shells has been made available to Marshal Wells Co. of Portland to be used by farmers for predatory animal control.

By order of the War Production Board farmers are eligible to buy these and other types of shells for predatory animal control. In order to obtain the shells the farmer must sign a certificate form at his dealer and he may then obtain the ammunition if the dealer is able to obtain it.

In Hermiston the Oregon Hardware & Implement Co. has the necessary certification forms. Any dealer who is an agent of Marshal Wells Co. has necessary instructions for securing this ammunition.

Farmers who need ammunition for predatory animal control are urged to get their order in to their dealer soon.
