

Sewer Ordinance

branches, wyes, traps and all plumbing fixtures to be connected therewith. When the proposed construction, connection or repair and all other matters connected therewith shall conform with this ordinance, with the plumbing code of the State of Oregon which is hereby adopted and made part of this ordinance as if it were herein set forth in full, and with all rules and regulations of the State Board of Health or of any other authority given jurisdiction over this work, as such rules and regulations are now in effect or may hereafter be amended, and which are hereby adopted and made part of this ordinance as if they were set forth in full, then the Sewer Inspector shall so certify and file said application and plan with the City Recorder. The City Recorder shall issue a permit therefor upon payment of \$1.00 which sum shall be paid and collected for the city before the permit shall be issued or any construction or work done.

Section 4: Connection. Wherever there is now or may hereafter be constructed in any street or alley, a public sewer for the purpose of carrying off sewage within the said City of Hermiston, the owner or owners of improved property abutting on, adjacent to or along the line of said sewer and within 200 feet of same, must connect and maintain a sewer connection with said sewer. Whenever the Sewer Inspector shall notify in writing the owner or owners of improved property as stated, it shall be the duty of the owner or owners to make a sewer connection application and file plans therefor in the manner provided and complete said connection within 60 days from the date of said notice, unless for good and sufficient reason the City Council shall approve an extension of time.

Section 5: Pipe. All sewer connections shall be made with sewer pipe not less than four inches in diameter. It shall be either Standard or Extra Heavy Cast Iron Soil Pipe, or first quality salt glazed thoroughly vitrified Clay Pipe conforming to A.S.T.M. "Standard Specifications for Clay Sewer Pipe" (C 13-40), or Standard Concrete Pipe conforming with A.S.T.M. "Standard Specifications for Concrete Sewer Pipe" (C 14-40 T). All sewer connections shall be laid to straight line or grade not less than one foot per one hundred foot length. Changes in line or grade shall not be made between the building and the wye or tee in the main sewer except when necessary to avoid obstructions, and then it shall be made only with suitable bends but not by chipping or cutting the pipe. Each connecting pipe line shall be carefully bedded as laid, and shall have at least one cleanout between the building and main sewer line, which cleanout shall be a standard cast iron body cleanout with brass plug caulked in-

to at least a two foot length of standard cast iron soil pipe.

Section 6: Joints. Joints in bell and spigot cast iron soil pipe shall be made with picked oakum and molten lead at least 1 inch deep, properly caulked to be gas and water tight. Joints in vitrified clay pipe shall be made with approved hot joining sewer material and dry jute packing. Such joining material shall not soften sufficiently to destroy the effectiveness of the joint when subjected to a temperature of 150 degrees, nor be soluble in any of the wastes carried by the drainage system. Joints in concrete pipe may be made with a mortar composed of one part Portland cement of an approved brand and two parts of clean sharp sand, well worked into the joint and smoothed with a bevel away from the joints. A ring of dry jute packing shall be caulked into hub ahead of the cement. The inside of the pipe where cement is used to make the joints shall be carefully cleaned and swabbed to prevent projection into the pipe of loose material or mortar.

Section 7: Connections to the Main Sewer. Where no branch is available within a reasonable distance, the sewer shall be tapped and a hub shall be cemented into a hole cut in pipe which hub shall not protrude past inside wall of sewer pipe. Sewers shall not be tapped below the center line of the pipe and all taps shall be inspected and meet with the approval of Sewer Inspector.

Section 8: Test. The joints shall be made permanently water tight and the trench shall not be backfilled until a water pressure test with not less than four foot head has been made to the satisfaction of and in the presence of the Sewer Inspector except where sewer branches have been extended inside the property line previous to the adoption of this ordinance.

Section 9: Excavations. Excavation in public streets and alleys for sewer connections shall be so made as to obstruct traffic as little as possible and shall be suitably barricaded with fences and red lights. All trenches shall be carefully backfilled by tamping or puddling with water as directed by the Sewer Inspector. If any pavement is cut, it shall be replaced by the property owner in a satisfactory manner. The entire sewer connection shall meet the approval of the Sewer Inspector before any sewage is allowed to pass through to public sewer.

Section 10: Obstructions. The Sewer Inspector shall advise the City Council immediately and the City shall have the right to refuse to issue a sewer connection permit, or the City shall have the right to disconnect and plug any existing sewer connection in case it is found that any of the following will be or have been discharged into the public sewer:

(a) Ashes, cinders, sand, earth, coal, sawdust, wood chips, garbage, rubbish, rags, metal or any other material, liquid or chemical that would

form a deposit or obstruction in the sewer or damage it or reduce its flow capacity.

(b) Grease, gasoline, oil, oil sludges, or other similar materials from wash racks, garages, machine shops, and other establishments. An adequate grease trap or catch basin which shall be constructed to meet the approval of the Sewer Inspector shall be required in the sewer connection from all wash racks, garages, machine shops, laundry, creamery, hotel, restaurant and other establishments that may waste grease, gasoline, cleaning fluids, inflammable liquids and similar materials.

(c) Paints, asphalt, bitumen, coal tar and other similar substances.

(d) Wheat, flour, grain, fruit pits, fruit skins, vegetable parings, and other similar material, except the waste liquid from same properly screened and settled.

(e) Garbage, tin cans, bottles, rubbish and other similar materials. These and all other materials shall not be dumped into manholes or pump pits.

(f) Any waste material or liquid which may obstruct or injure the sewers or which do not yield readily to treatment by the process used in the sewage disposal plant. No acid, corrosive liquid, germicide or antiseptic of such strength and quantity as to interfere with bacterial action in the sewage disposal plant shall be discharged into public sewers.

Section 11: Separate Connections. Separate sewer connections shall be provided for each city lot and more than one in case the Sewer Inspector decides that better service will be afforded or that the system or disposal plant can be better operated.

Section 12: Septic Tanks. Where there are existing septic tanks in use or cess pools before the sewer connection is required, the sewer connection shall not drain same but it shall run direct from the house or building soil pipe to the public sewer. Immediately after connection the septic tank or cess pool shall be completely filled with earth. All septic tanks shall be replaced with sewer connections within 90 days after adoption of this ordinance unless for good and sufficient reason the City Council grants an extension of time.

Section 13: Outside Toilets. Within 90 days from the adoption of this ordinance and thereafter no outdoor toilet or privy shall be permitted within 150 feet of any public sewer which is adjacent to or abutting the property. The Sewer Inspector shall serve written notice on all such property owners that adequate plumbing and sewer connection must be installed as herein provided, and if not so installed within the time stated, the Sewer Inspector shall report each case fully to the City Council for their action.

Section 14: No spring, creek, surface water drainage, downspout, refrigerator or other receptacle in which provisions are kept, open fixtures, steam exhaust, boiler, blow-off, or drip pipes shall be connected with the city sewer without permission and the approval of the Sewer Inspector.

Section 15: No unauthorized person or persons shall enter or obstruct or damage any manhole, sewer, pump pit, sewer pump or anything pertaining to said sewer system. No unauthorized person or persons shall enter the sewage disposal plant enclosure or structures or tamper or interfere or damage same in any manner. No person or persons shall interfere or obstruct any city official, sewer inspector or city employee when installing, operating, repairing, maintaining or inspecting any sewer, manhole, pump pit, or the sewage disposal plant or when inspecting any private sewer connection. The Sewer Inspector, the City Health Officer, City Councilmen or other authorized employee or person shall have the right to enter upon the premises and enter any house or building of the City of Hermiston at all reasonable hours for the purpose of inspection of sewers, drains, traps and plumbing fixtures connected therewith. If it shall be found from such inspection or otherwise that any provision of law or ordinance is not being complied with in any respect, or that any part of drainage system is in need of cleaning out or repair, the City Inspector or other city representative shall immediately serve notice upon the owner and upon the tenant or occupant, specifying the work to be done to make the installation, system or condition comply with state law, Board of Health code and the city ordinance. Then it shall be the duty of every person served with said notice to comply therewith.

Section 16: Appeal. Appeal may be taken to the City Council from any ruling or decision by the Sewer Inspector either granting or refusing a sewer connection permit.

Section 17: Location Map. It shall be the duty of the Sewer Inspector to keep in the City Recorder's office complete public sewer maps on which shall be drawn when laid the location of each sewer connection with any measurements necessary to show the location, depth and any other detail concerning same. The sewer connection permit number shall be placed alongside each on the maps for reference.

Section 18: Penalties. Any person, persons, firm, company or corporation violating the terms and provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof before the City Recorder, be subject to a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than 50.00 dollars and in default of payment of any such fine shall be imprisoned in the city jail one day for each two dollars thereof unpaid.

Section 19: Emergency Clause. That inasmuch as it is necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City that the new City Sewer System be placed in operation as soon as possible, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor. Passed the Council this 9th day of July, 1943.
