### BUTTER RAISES IN POINT VALUE

The red-stamp cost of meats during August will be substantially the same as at present, while the housewife will pay an additional two ration points a pound for butter and one point less for shortening, lard, salad and cooking oils, the Office of Price Administration announced today.

These changes are made in the fifth OPA official table of consumer point values for meats, fats and dairy products, which is effective from August 1 through September 4.

In contrast to previous months, the changes in meat values are negligible, with the major revisions confined to the fats and oils group.

The two-point increase in the value of butter, which places the ration cost of this item at 10 points per pound, is offset to some extent by the cut of one point in lard, shortening, salad and cooking oils. No change is made in the value of margarine, which remains at the July figure of four

points per pound.  
The OPA stated these revisions do not reflect any material change in the estimated civilian supply of fats and oils products, but are an attempt to bring consumer demand closer into line with the available supply. Point values must be adjusted to move the supplies allocated by the War Food Administration for civilian use during the July-August-September quarter.

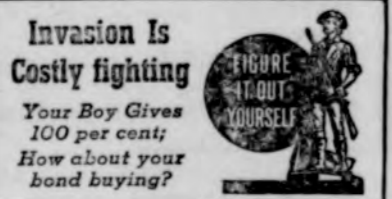
