Getting the Most from your Victory Garden



WHEN TO PLANT YOUR VICTORY GARDEN

"Sow too early and you waste seed; sow too late and you waste time," runs a valuable bit of old-time garden advice.

Consulting experienced home or market gardeners in the community is one practical way of learning the proper time for planting various vegetables.

In normal years, Mr. Drewes states, seed of radish, lettuce, peas, spinach, onion, Swiss chard, beets, and carrots can safely be sown two to three weeks before the average date of the last killing frost.

Tender crops such as beans, corn, squash, cucumber, and okra must usually wait until two to three weeks after the last spring frost date before seed is sown.

SOLDIERS TO GET MANY TURKEYS

The government freeze on turkeys while 10 million pounds are obtained for the armed forces is not expected to extend much beyond October 1.

Some changes in weight limits have been made so that now the army will take hens weighing eight pounds and up, while toms will be accepted from 14 to 30 pounds.

Purchasers for the government are authorized to pay from 39 to 41 1/2 cents for No. 1 birds of the various classes delivered in Portland.
