CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

ANCIENT and Modern Necromancy, Alias Mesmerism and Hypnotism, Denounced" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, November 28.

The Golden Text was, "Be merciful unto me, O God: for man would swallow me up; he fighting daily oppresseth me. . . . What time I am afraid, I will trust in thee" (Ps. 56: 1, 3).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "And Jesus knew their thoughts, and said unto them, every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand. But if I cast out devils by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God is come unto you" (Matt. 12:25, 28).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following correlative passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy: "Human will-power is not Science. Human will belongs to the so-called material senses, and its use is to be condemned. Willing the sick to recover is not the metaphysical practice of Christian Science, but is sheer animal magnetism" (p 144).
