KNOW YOUR CITY ORDINANCES

Ordinance No. 188

Section 1: No person shall ride or operate any bicycle upon any street, alley or public place within the City of Hermiston during the period from a half hour after sunset until a half hour before sunrise, without having a lighted lamp affixed to the front of

said bicycle, visible under normal atmospheric conditions from a distance of at least 300 feet in front of said bicycle, and also a reflex mirror or lighted lamp on the rear of said bicycle exhibiting a red light visible under like conditions from a distance of at least 200 feet to the rear of said bicycle.

Section 2: No person shall operate or ride any bicycle upon the streets, alleys or public places of the City of Hermiston with two or more persons upon the same bicycle.

Section 4: No person shall ride or operate any bicycle upon any sidewalk on Main Street between First and Third Streets.

Section 5: Every person riding or operating a bicycle on any street, alley or public place in the City of Hermiston shall keep said bicycle in the extreme right of the traffic lane, and it shall be unlawful for two or more riders or operators of bicycles abreast or to ride or operate a bicycle otherwise than in single file.

Section 7: No operator or owner of a bicycle shall leave his bicycle on any sidewalk in the City of Hermiston or placed in such a manner as to hinder or impede pedestrian or vehicular traffic.

Section 8: Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before the City Recorder, be punished by impounding his bicycle in the office of the City Recorder for such period as the City Recorder shall designate.

Section 9: Every person riding or operating a bicycle upon any street, alley or public place in the City of Hermiston shall be subject to all the provisions of the laws of the State of Oregon, and ordinances of the City applicable to the drivers of vehicles.

U.O.D. OFFICER GETS PROMOTION

Captain Herbert A. Miller, Storage Officer at the Umatilla Ordnance Depot, recently received notice of his promotion in rank from First Lieutenant.

Captain Miller received his B. S. degree in Agriculture from Michigan State College in 1930 and at this time was commissioned as Second Lieutenant, Cavalry, Officers Reserve Corps. While in college he was affiliated with the Alpha Gamma Rho fraternity.

After graduation he was employed for one year by the Agricultural Economics division of Michigan State college. He was transferred from Savanna to the Umatilla Ordnance Depot on May 15, 1942.
