CAR-SHARING IS STRESSED AS GAS SHORTAGE NEARS

The local office of the War Price and Rationing board has received information from the Portland office concerning the shortage of gasoline in this area. In part the message read: "The gasoline shortage in this area is critical and will become more so as the Pacific war activity develops. Civilian consumption of gasoline for the month of December, 1943, exceeded the allocation of supply by 15,000 barrels per day on the Pacific Coast. With military requirements increasing, further restrictions in the civilian allocation by the Petroleum Administrator for War are expected. Immediate action to eliminate all unnecessary mileage rations must be taken and greater emphasis placed upon maximum car-sharing."

The local board has received an intricate method of more strict gas rationing. In short, however, it is certain that civilians will receive less gas during the next several months and different methods of saving gas will be necessary. Car-sharing is considered one of the most important.

WATER FACILITY LOANS AVAILABLE

Irrigation developments and farmstead water facilities provide some of the most economical and quickest ways of increasing productive acreage for the production of vital war crops in Northeastern Oregon in the opinion of the local County FSA committee and Gene Hampton, County FSA Supervisor, 211 John's Building, Pendleton, Oregon.

There are many possibilities for bringing more land into new or more intensive production through repair or extension of present ditches, installation of small pump outfits, overhead sprinklers, and the digging of new wells.

"It is felt in the present irrigated districts that much could be accomplished by improving the present domestic water supply to protect the families health and at the same time enabling farmers to produce Grade A milk and Grade A dairy products under more favorable sanitary conditions," said Gene Hampton.

Another important phase of the water facility program which may be considered in this area is the possibility of developing range water supply for sheep and beef cattle on the summer ranges.

Water Facility loans bearing 3 per cent interest and running for a period of one to twenty years, depending on the type of facility, are available to eligible farmers who need them.

Water Facility loans are not confined to FSA borrowers but are available to other farmers who are operating economic family-type farms and who are not able to secure adequate credit elsewhere. Applications can be made through the County FSA Supervisor's office.
